
A division bench of Justices R D Dhanuka and Kamal Khata said the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) cannot be permitted to consider and allow the second application filed by a company run by the Rane family, seeking regularisation of the unauthorised construction as it would encourage "wholesale unauthorised constructions".

The court directed the BMC to demolish the unauthorised parts within a period of two weeks and submit a compliance report to the court one week thereafter. The bench also imposed a cost of ₹ 10 lakh on Mr Rane and directed for the amount to be deposited towards the Maharashtra State Legal Services Authority within two weeks. Mr Rane's advocate Shardul Singh sought that the court stay its order for six weeks so that he could approach the Supreme Court in appeal. The bench, however, rejected it.

The court dismissed the petition filed by Kaalkaa Real Estates, a company owned by Mr Rane's family seeking directions to the BMC to decide their second application uninfluenced by the orders passed by the civic body earlier. The BMC had in June this year rejected the regularisation application, noting that there were violations in the construction.

The company filed a second application in July, saying it was seeking regularisation of a smaller portion as compared to what it had sought previously, and under new provisions of the Development Control and Promotion Regulation 2034.

Shinde-BJP alliance won more than 50 percent seats in panchayat elections



he ruling Eknath Shinde-BJP alliance and the deportee Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) have both claimed victory in Gram Panchayat elections held three days ago. While Devendra Fadnavis believed the BJP has become the number 1 party in Maharashtra again. On the other hand NCP's Ajit Pawar claimed the MVA has won most of the seats. The Sharad Pawarled NCP came a distant second, while the Congress stands third in the tally and Uddhav Thackeray's faction is fourth. BJP's Maharashtra unit president Chandrashekhar Bawankule claimed

that 259 Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-supported candidates and 40 nominees backed by the Shiv Sena faction headed by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde have been elected as sarpanches.

More than 50 per cent of the newly-elected sarpanches are supporters of the Shinde-BJP alliance. In Nashik, out of 88 gram panchayats in Nashik, NCP won 41, Thackeray faction 13, the BJP and Congress five each, Shinde camp one, and CPM eight.

In Pune, out of 61 gram panchayats in Pune, NCP won 30, six were held unopposed, the BJP and Shinde camp three each and local alliances won 23. Yavatmal (70 gram panchayats), Congress won 33, BJP 20, NCP nine, Thackeray faction three and local alliances six. In the sugarcane-rich Ahmednagar, NCP won 20 gram panchayats, BJP 16 and local alliances nine. Nandurbar (75 gram panchayats): BJP registered victory in 42 gram panchayats, Shinde camp won 28.

Voting for elections to 547 gram panchayats spread across 16 districts of the state was held on Sunday and 76 per cent turnout was reported. The elections were held on a non-party basis and the counting of votes was taken up on Monday. Besides elections to gram panchayats, direct polls for the post of village sarpanches were also held. Senior NCP leader Ajit Pawar stressed that the rural polls are not contested on party symbols.

Meanwhile, elections for 1,166 Gram Panchayat in Maharashtra will take place on October 13. The 1,166 Gram Panchayats are spread in 18 districts. The polling will take place to elect Sarpanch and Gram Panchayat members. Voting will be conducted in all the villages going to polls on October 13 from 7.30 am to 5:50 pm. In the Maoist-hit areas, polling will end at 3 pm. Counting of votes will take place on October 14.

Vedanta decided to move project to Gujarat during MVA rule is lie: Ajit Pawar

CP leader Ajit Pawar on Tuesday dubbed as "complete lies" the Maharashtra government's claim that Vedanta-Foxconn had decided to take their project to Gujarat when the Maha Vikas Aghadi was in power in Maharashtra.

The Eknath Shinde-led Maharashtra government and the opposition have been holding each other responsible for the multibillion project going to neighbouring Gujarat.



The joint venture semiconductor project of the Indian conglomerate Vedanta and Taiwanese electronics giant Foxconn, proposed to be set up near Pune city earlier, will come up in Gujarat now.

The Uddhav Thackeray-led MVA government, which comprised the Shiv Sena, NCP and Congress, collapsed in June this year after Shinde led a revolt against the Sena leadership. Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister and BJP leader Devendra Fadnavis on Friday alleged that a "10 per cent commission" had to be paid when the MVA was in power for every subsidy that was announced.

Addressing a press conference in Mumbai on Tuesday, Ajit Pawar, the leader of opposition in the Maharashtra Assembly, challenged the government to conduct a probe into the charge that money was being asked by some in the MVA government which led to the (Vedanta-Foxconn) company deciding to set up its plant in Gujarat.

hief Minister of Maharashtra on Tuesday reconstituted the subcommittee for the reservation of Marathas to be implemented in education and government jobs for this panel discusson technical education minister Chandrakant patil has been appointed as the head of the panel. In the chief minister's office discussion of the committee said that will be following up on the legal and technical aspects to ensure the Maratha community will be getting its quota.

In the discussion of this matter state ministers Radhakrishna Vikhe Patil, Girish Mahajan, Dada Bhuse, Shambhuraj Desai and Uday Samant are other members of the committee were present.

Earlier the head of the subcommittee was former minister Ashok Chavan under the Maha Vikas Aghadi government.

The claim was filed by the family of Rahul Mukesh Chandara Dixit, an employee of Reliance Jio Infocomm Ltd seeking compensation to the tune of Rs 1.99 crore.

The petitioners had claimed that on February 1, 2020 Dixit was travelling towards Shilphata via Mahape-Shilphata road on his two-wheeler, when a trailer dashed his vehicle from behind and ran over him.

Advocate K V Poojari appearing for Reliance General Insurance Co.Ltd, one of the respondents in the case, argued that the entire case was a concocted one.

After hearing the arguments, the tribunal observed that the

case had been fabricated. The trailer owner, who owns a transport business, had colluded with the claimants and police to create eye-witnesses.

The claim was the outcome of mala fide intention on the part of the petitioners, who had planted the vehicle (the trailer) by joining hands with the trailer owner and the police, it said.

The tribunal observed that while the man had died after being hit by some unknown vehicle, the petitioners were not entitled to claim the compensation as the offending trailer was not involved in this accident

Four booked for employing children, practising bonded labour in Palghar

F IR have been registered against four persons in Maharashtra's Thane and Palghar districts for allegedly employing children and practising bonded labour, police said on Tuesday.

The cases were registered at Padgha police station in Thane and Jawhar police station in Palghar on Monday and no arrests have been made so far, an official said. According to the police, the case registered in Jawhar was against Deoram Kandadkar and Pundalik Kandadkar, who had allegedly taken two sisters, aged six and eight, to Akole in Ahmednagar and employed them to graze sheep and goats.

The parents of the girls in Jawhar were paid a meagre sum for the work done by the children since March 2021 till this month, the official said.

Similarly, two FIRs were registered against Bhiva Goikar

and Sambaji Khatal of Raigad and Ahmednagar, who had allegedly employed two boys, aged 17 and 12, from Padgha over the last couple of years, he said.

Based on complaints lodged by the parents of the victims, the cases were registered under the Bonded Labour System (Abolition) Act, Child Labour (Prohibition and Regulation) Act and Juvenile Justice Act, the official added.

NIA gets 90-day extension to file charge sheet in pharmacist murder

special court here on Tuesday granted 90 days extension to the National Investigation Agency (NIA) to file a charge sheet in the case of murder of pharmacist Umesh Kolhe in Maharashtra's Amravati city.

Kolhe was killed on June 21 after he shared on social media a post supporting suspended Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) spokesperson Nupur Sharma over her controversial remarks about Prophet Mohammad.

Ten people have so far been arrested in the case, while four are absconding, as per the probe agency. The NIA had sought more time to file the charge sheet, saying in order to complete the chain of events (that led to the murder) with "cogent and reliable evidence", it will require another 90 days.

A counsel for the accused had opposed the NIA's plea. After hearing both the sides, special judge A K Lahoti granted 90 days time to the NIA time to file the charge sheet.

The NIA had told the court that the accused were misleading the probe agency and as a result, they had to record statements of 20 witnesses last week and it will require time for corroboration.

The agency said the accused have the right to remain silent but they cannot mislead the probe.

Man killed by unidentified persons in Mumbr

20-year-old man was killed by unidentified persons in Mumbra town of Maharashtra's Thane district, police said on Tuesday.

The body of Mohammad Ittehad Mohammad Abdul Vashid, a native of Malda in West Bengal, was found in a house in Kausa area of the town on Monday morning, an official said.

An offence under section 302 (murder) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) was registered against unidentified persons, the station house officer of Mumbra police station said. The victim's throat had been slit with a sharp weapon, he said, adding that the body has been sent for post-mortem to a government hospital.

BJP noids massive protest against Rajasthan govt for cattle deaths



The Bharatiya Janata Party held a massive protest over the death of thousands of cattle in Rajasthan due to Lumpy skin disease. As per reports, Lumpy disease is a viral disease that affects cattle. It is transmitted by blood-feeding insects, such as certain species of flies and mosquitoes, or ticks. It causes fever and nodules on the skin and can lead to the death of the cattle.

Rajasthan BJP chief Satish Poonia climbed atop a police barricade during the party's protest in Jaipur. Earlier, in an unusual incident on Monday, Pushkar BJP MLA Suresh Rawat reached the Rajasthan Assembly along with a cow. The act was carried out with the aim to protest against the spread of Lumpy disease in livestock.

As soon as the BJP MLA reached the spot and started giving a statement, the cow ran away. On September 19, Rajasthan Chief Minister took note of the issue and said that the addressal of the lumpy disease is the state government's priority however the vaccines for the same would be given by the Centre.

"I called a meeting on August 15 regarding lumpy skin disease and called the leaders of the opposition, talked to everyone, talked to the religious leaders, our priority is how to save the lives of cows from lumpy skin disease, but the central government will give the vaccines and medicines," tweeted CM Gehlot.

The Karnataka Cabinet has decided to withdraw 35 criminal cases registered in various police stations of the state. The Cabinet's decision came in accordance with the recommendation of a sub-committee. In the meeting that was held on Monday night, the Cabinet gave its nod over several matters including the appointment of civic workers as government employees.

The meeting at the Vidhan Soudha concluded with the nod to approve the appointment of civic workers who were performing duties on an outsourcing basis as government employees.

With this, the government will appoint 11,133 civil servants serving in the Municipal Corporations and other local bodies of the state as government employees under the special recruitment rules. 3,673 employees of Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP), 5,533 in municipal councils and 1,927 civil servants in municipal corporations are working on contract basis.

Now recruitment will be done as government employees and the civil servants will be working under the pay scale of Rs 17,000-28,980, the meeting concluded ne person was arrested at Karipur airport, who was carrying one kilogram of gold inside four capsules in his stomach. The accused has been identified as Naufal (36), a native of Variamkode in the Malappuram district. He arrived at Karipur airport from Dubai on September 19.

was taken to a private hospital at Kondotty and was subjected to a detailed medical examination. The X-ray revealed four capsules containing gold inside his stomach.

This is the 59th gold smuggling case being reported at Karipur airport within the past few months. Strong tremors were felt in nearby Colima which is situated around 100 kilometers (62 miles) from the epicentre whereas light to moderate shaking was felt in Mexico City. Moreover, several buildings are closed by firefighters due to concerns of collapse, according to local media.

UK plans to replace Chinese language schools with teachers from Taiwan

group of cross-party British lawmakers is in talks with Taiwan to provide Chineselanguage teachers to the United Kingdon as the government seeks to phase out Confucius Institutes, according to media reports.

Chinese state-linked Confucius language learning and teaching project has been under heavy scrutiny as the bilateral relations between China and the UK continue to deteriorate. Taipei Times reported that there are 30 branches of the institute operating across the UK. Notably, the schools are effectively joint ventures between a host university in Britain, a partner university in China and the Chinese International Education Foundation, a Beijing-based organization.

Earlier in 2014, current British Prime Minister Liz Truss had praised the network of Confucius



classrooms. Serving as education minister at the time, she said the institutes "will put in place a strong infrastructure for Mandarin" in the UK, as per agencies.

However, now the last week's reports suggested that she was prepared to declare China an "acute threat" to the UK's national security, placing it in the same category as Russia. Citing a study conducted by the China Research Group showed in June, Taipei Times reported that almost all British government spending on Chinese-language teaching at schools is channelled through university-based Confucius Institutes.

As per the estimates, the amounts to at least PS7 million (US\$8.1 million) allocated from 2015 to 2024. Under the new proposal, the funding could be redirected to alternative programs such as those from Taiwan.

Game over for Shehbaz govt as Pakistan reels under economic distress: Rashid Ahmed

Former Interior Minister of Pakistan, Sheikh Rashid Ahmed, on Sunday slammed the Shehbaz Sharif-led government for the deteriorating economic situation in Pakistan and said that it is game over for the ruling government now. Taking to Twitter, Ahmed wrote, "The Supreme Court will restore 150 corruption references of the rulers, God willing.

"The NAB amendments will be invalidated and the 10 million overseas Pakistanis will get the right to vote," he said. Taking a sharp dig at Pakistan People's Party (PPP) chairman, Bilawal Bhutto-Zardari, the former Interior Minister said Bhutto came to Pakistan as a guest actor and did not attend his office, reported agencies.

In a subsequent tweet, he said the PDM had burdened Paki-

stan with extreme inflation and claimed that the "petrol mafia" had prevented the government from reducing fuel prices for three days now.

Notably, the massive rise in inflation in Pakistan has also resulted in demand destruction and created difficulties for the citizens to meet their basic requirements. With a shrinking economy and rising inflation in Pakistan, experts worry that Pakistan's future is bleak saying that while Sri Lanka's collapse worries the region, Pakistan's collapse should also be a cause for concern. The inflation increased by 6.34 per cent monthon-month (MoM) and reached 21.32 per cent year-on-year (YoY) in June. According to the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP), inflation in the country will remain in the range of 18-20 per cent this fiscal year.

Eight Indian fishermen held by Sri Lankan Navy



Eight Indian fishermen were apprehended by Sri Lankan Navy for allegedly engaging in "illegal fishing" in Sri Lankan waters, according to Q branch police. As per the police statement, the fishermen were apprehended about 22 nautical miles from Jagadapattinam at 10.00 pm on Monday. Last month, ten Indian fishermen had been arrested by the Sri Lankan Navy, the Sri Lankan fishermen association said.

Prior to that, nine fishermen travelling in a boat from the coastal district of Tamil Nadu have been arrested for allegedly trespassing and fishing in Sri Lankan waters. Rameswaram Police said the arrested fishermen from Nagapattinam are being taken to Trincomalee port. Earlier, Sri Lankan Navy rescued six Indian fishermen who were stranded after their boat drifted in Lankan waters due to a glitch.

Fishermen hailing from Tamil Nadu's Rameswaram went into the sea for fishing. Around 532 boats from Rameswaram fishing harbour left for the sea. But the boat owned by Sagear Pandian developed a mechanical snag in the Palk Bay area, the Indian-Sri Lankan sea border

A resident of Hariwan Municipality-2 in Sarlahi, Lal Mohammad, was shot three roundstwo on the head and one on the thigh, the CCTV video from the incident site confirmed following which he was taken to Tribhuwan University Teaching Hospital in Maharajgunj. Yet, he died there," Spokesman of District Police Range Kathmandu, SP Dineshraj Mainali told agencies. The shootout took place at Gothatar on the outskirts of Kathmandu. As per the official, Lal was seriously injured in the shootout.

Released CCTV footage showcased the assailants chasing Lal Mohammad while aiming fire at him. However, the unidentified persons fled the scene after a girl (confirmed to be the victim's daughter) jumped down from the first floor of the house.

Police have only been able to confirm that the attackers were wearing a red t-shirt and jeans and drove a motorcycle.

Tribesmen hold protests against atrocities of Khyber police

ngry locals of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province of Pakistan blocked roads for several hours on Sunday to protest against rising atrocities by Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Police. Dawn reported that the agitators blocked the main Peshawar-Torkham Highway for long hours, demanding the Khyber police stop their atrocities and unlawful acts in the region.

The protest emerged straight after some officials in a recent incident forced the vehicle of one of the protestors to stop and forcibly search the personal belongings of the female family members, insisting that the women were drug carriers. As per Dawn, the women were held under illegal detention and subjected to an unlawful body search. Moreover, their vehicle was also taken to an auto workshop for further search. The family demanded the suspension of the officials involved in the detention of women by unlawful means and a brief enquiry into their acts.

The deteriorated law and order situation in Khyber Pakh-

tunkhwa has always been a major cause of concern for the locals residing in the region and have only added to the miseries of their lives.

In a recent move, the Chamkani tribe of Kurram in Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province gathered outside the Peshawar Press Club and protested carrying banners and placards inscribed with slogans of their demands, urging the government to take practical and effective steps to maintain law and order.

Hicks, who was born in Petersburg, Virginia, attended Howard University and earned a degree before embarking on a career that lasted for forty years. She started out as a musician and released her debut record under her own name in 1991, which featured the tune "Never Been in Love Before."
