11 jawans soldiers have received Veergati in Dantewada Naxalite attack



Security forces encounter with Naxalites in Dantewada, Chhattisgarh. Naxalites have blown up a vehicle with a bomb. In this attack, 10 soldiers have received Veergati. The 10 security personnel and a driver were killed in an improvised explosive device blast carried out by naxalites in

Dantewada district. The incident took place under Aranpur police station limits when a team of the state police's District Reserve Guard (DRG) was returning after an anti-Naxalite operation, news agency PTI reported citing a senior official. The area is located around 450 km from state capital Raipur. Chief Minis-

ter Bhupesh Baghel said that we will not spare the Naxalites, we will eliminate them. Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Wednesday spoke to Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel and took stock of the situation after 10 security personnel were killed in a blast carried out by Naxals in Dantewada. Shah assured CM Baghel of all possible help from the central government to deal with the situation. In a tweet, Shah said: "Anguished by the cowardly attack on the Chhattisgarh police at Dantewada. He spoke to Chhattisgarh's Chief Minister and assured all possible assistance to the state government.

more than half of their electricity needs from natural gas. In the face of an energy crisis led by war-lock Ukraine and Russia, European countries have now come to depend upon, along with other countries, India too to meet their demand for gas. For though we import crude oil, but export refined petroleum products that the refineries of the companies like 'Nyara' and 'Reliance' produce. Of such petroleum products most prominent is Vacuum gas oil (VGO), which is used as refinery feedstock and happens to be the main source of gasoline essential for electricity production. And it is this gasoline that the European countries use for themselves. But among them, France is exception to this. For within time it had fast started working in the direction of nuclear sector as an alternative to petrol. And therefore, it is unaffected with the present crisis, as its 70% of electricity need gets fulfilled through nuclear power.

Along with hydro- solarwind power sector India also has long back taken forward the steps toward the acquiring nuclear power capabilities like France. One such plant is under construction in Kudankulam, Tamilnadu. It is notably regarding the same nuclear power plant that once church came into limelight for its protest against it. Demonstration, agitation and all the tactices that were possible it adopted to have the project shut down. The then minister of Manmohan Singhled UPA government, Narayan Samy, even had alleged that the two NGOs affiliated with bishop were given 54 crores rupees in the matter. Fortunately, all the tactics failed, and construction of nuclear plant went ahead.

Being built with the cooperation of Russia, the first phase construction of the plant had been completed in 2013.



Second and third phases would have been completed by 2023. While rest of the phases are expected to have been completed by 2026-27. Today the biggest nuclear power plant of the Europe lies in Zaporizhzhia, Ukraine, which now has come under the occupation of Russia in the war. But now with completion, Kudankulam will get to be bigger than that, the cost of which is expected to be 90,000 crores. Now two reactors have got be operative, their electrical production capacity

being 1000 megawatts. While with 4 more reactors to have come into operation the total capacity will get to be 6000 megawatts.

Govt should talk to locals opposing refinery find alternative site if issue not resolved: Sharad Pawar



ationalist Congress Party (NCP) president Sharad Pawar on Wednesday said the Maharashtra government should hold a dialogue with local villagers who are opposing a refinery project in the coastal Ratnagiri district. If the issue was not resolved even after that, an alternative site should be found, he said.

Pawar spoke to reporters here after state industries minister Uday Samant met him to discuss the issue. Residents of Barsu village in Ratnagiri district's Rajapur tehsil, more than 400 km from Mumbai, are up in arms against the project and the Shiv Sena (UBT) and Congress, the NCP's allies in the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) coalition, are supporting them.

Pawar said his party did not oppose development projects in Konkan, but finding out the opinion of the locals was a must. "The government needs to find out why the locals are angry... having a dialogue with them is the only solution. If the matter is not resolved through a dialogue, an alternative site should be found," the former Union minister said.

On the state government's contention that Uddhav Thackeray, when he was chief minister, had suggested Barsu as an alternative instead of Nanar, the original site, Pawar said he was not aware of that.

"Industries minister Uday Samant who met me assured that a dialogue will take place tomorrow. Yesterday only soil testing was being done at the site," he further said.

NCP leaders will visit the site and talk to the locals, Pawar added. Samant, who is the guardian minister of Ratnagiri district, told reporters that the women protestors detained at the project site have been released. "The government will speak to the villagers," he added.

Have been batting for transparency in departmental postings, but not getting success, says BJP minister

Aurangabad university professor booked on charge of raping student

professor from Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University in Maharashtra's Aurangabad city has been booked for allegedly raping a student for over a year and harassing her parents, an official said on Wednesday. The professor's wife has also been named in the first information report (FIR) for supporting

the professor in the alleged crime and telling the complainant that they wanted a son from her, the official said.

The FIR was registered at Begumpura police station on Tuesday night under Indian Penal Code sections 376 (rape), 109 (abetment), 114 (abettor present when offence is committed) and 504 (intentional insult).

Maharashtra: 11 IPS officers transferred



The Maharashtra government on Tuesday transferred or promoted 11 Indian Police Service officers between the ranks of Deputy Inspector General (DIG) to Additional Director General of Police (ADG). According to the orders issued by the home department, senior IPS officer Sanjay Saxena has been transferred as ADG Law and Order at the state police headquarters in Mumbai. Anup Kumar Singh has been posted as Principal Secretary of the home department.

Shiv Sena (UBT) to launch agitation against refinery in Maharashtra's Ratnagiri district



he Uddhav Thackerayled Shiv Sena (UBT) has decided to launch an agitation against a proposed petroleum refinery at Barsu village in Maharashtra's coastal Ratnagiri district amid protests against the project by local residents.

A decision to this effect was taken on Tuesday at a meeting of Shiv Sena (UBT) MPs called by party president Thackeray in Mumbai. The meeting was called to take a stand on the multi-billion project and decide the future course of action.

The decision was taken on a day when the Ratnagiri police arrested 111 people, most of them women, during a protest against the proposed refinery, an official said.

Fire destroys makeshift godown in Thane district

fire destroyed a makeshift godown that stored plastic and materials for hoardings in Maharashtra's Thane district in the early hours of Wednesday, an official said. No one was injured in the accident at Kausa in Mumbra, said Avinash Sawant, chief of the Regional Disaster Management Cell (RDMC) of the Thane civic body.

The fire broke out at the godown around 5.10 am, he said. Two fire engines and water tankers were sent to the spot and the fire was brought under control in nearly two hours, he said, adding that the cause of the fire is yet to be ascertained.

I am not on leave, says Maha CM Shinde

mid claims by the rival Shiv Sena faction that he was on his way out, Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde told reporters on Tuesday that the reports that he was "on leave" were wrong. Shinde is on a three-day visit to his home district. Speaking to reporters at Mahabaleshwar, he said he has been



reviewing various works, meeting people and holding meetings with officials since arrival in the district.

aharashtra on Tuesday reported 722 fresh Covid-19 cases and three fatalities, taking the tally of infections to 81,62,842 and the death toll to 1.48.507, the

state health department said. The fresh cases rose thrice compared to Monday when 226 infections were recorded in the state. No Covid-19 fatality was recorded a day before.

Withdrawing summons issued to Arvind Kejriwal in property defacement case: Goa police tell HC

he Goa police on Wednesday told the Bombay High Court that they are withdrawing the summons issued to Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, in which he was asked to appear before them on April 27 in a case related to the illegal sticking of posters on public properties during the 2022 Assembly elections campaign. The police had issued the notice suo motu to the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) national convener on April 13 under section 41 (A) of the Code of Criminal Pro-

cedure (CrPC). But Kejriwal challenged the summons issued to him by the Pernem police, asking him to appear before the investigating officer on April 27 in connection with the case.

The case was heard by a division bench comprising Justices Mahesh Sonak and Valmiki Menezes of the Goa bench of the Bombay High Court on Wednesday, during which the police submitted that they are going to withdraw the summons issued to Kejriwal. PTI

Unseasonal rains damage standing, harvested crops in Telangana

eavy rainfall lashed Telangana resulting Lin damage of standing and harvested crops at several places. According to the 'Daily Weather Report of Telangana State Wednesday, issued by the Met Centre of IMD here, heavy rainfall occurred at a few places in Medchal-Malkajgiri and Narayanpet districts and at isolated places in Jangaon, Khammam, Kamareddy, Medak and other districts of the State on Tuesday. Rain also occurred at most places across Telangana, it said.

Mirdoddi in Siddipet district received 10 cms of rain, followed by Mominpet in Vikarabad district and Bhuvanagiri (both 9 cms). The rainfall caused damage to standing and harvested crops, including paddy, maize and red chillies in Khammam, Warangal and other districts.

Ruling BRS Working President and State Municipal Administration Minister K T Rama Rao said in a release that the State government would stand by farmers whose crops were damaged due to unseasonal rains. PTI

148 students in residential schools of Jharkhand tested positive for Covid-19

ne-hundred and fortyeight students in four girls' residential schools in Jharkhand's East Singhbhum district have tested positive for Covid-19, an official said on Wednesday. Deputy Commissioner Vijaya Jadhav on Tuesday directed to carry out Covid-19 test in all Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBV) schools in the district after 69 students tested positive for the virus on Monday, the official said.

Led by Civil Surgeon Dr Jujhar Majhi doctors carried out Covid-19 testing in three other KGBV schools in Dumaria, Potka and Jamshedpur blocks of the district and detected 79 more students inflicted with the virus. While KGBV Dumaria recorded for 14 cases, KGBV Potka 10 and



KGBV Jamshedpur 55 Covid-19, an official statement said.

All the students were isolated as per Coronavirus protocol and the school premises were completely sanitised. On the directive of Jadhav, the Civil Surgeon had a virtual meeting with the wardens, teaching and non-teaching staff of all KGBVs and ordered them to implement Covid-19 guidelines. The deputy commissioner also directed health officials to conduct Covid-19 tests in railway stations, bus stands, schools and colleges to contain the spread of the virus in view of increasing coronavirus cases. PTI

Centre to SC: Consider leaving questions raised in same sex marriage pleas to parliament

The Centre on Wednesday requested the Supreme Court to consider leaving questions raised in the pleas seeking legal sanction for same sex marriages to Parliament. Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre, told a five-judge Constitution bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud that the apex court is dealing with a "very complex subject", which has a "profound social impact". "The

real question is who would take a call on what constitutes marriage and between whom," Mehta said on the fifth day of hearing.

He told the bench, also comprising Justices S K Kaul, S R Bhat, Hima Kohli and P S Narasimha, that there would be ramifications on several other statutes which would need a debate in the society and also in various state legislatures. Hearing in the matter is underway. PTI

Delhi: 30-year-old cab driver arrested for sexually assaulting six-year-old girl

30-year-old cab driver was arrested on Wednesday for allegedly sexually assaulting a six-year-old girl while ferrying her to school, said Deputy Commissioner of Police South East Rajesh Deo. The police informed that the accused had been identified as Mohd Azhar.

According to the police, the accused has been arrested on the



basis of a complaint registered by the victim's mother.

Giving details, DCP Deo said, "The complainant reported that the accused driver engaged a cab for ferrying her six-year-old daughter to school." "On Wednesday, the victim informed her mother that the driver of the cab has been touching her private parts inappropriately while ferrying her from school for about last one year," added DCP. ANI

Global community urges China to release 11th Panchem Lama



n the occasion of the 34th birthday of the 11th Panchem Lama, Gedhun Choekyi Nyima, the global community on Tuesday urged China to provide proof of life and account for his whereabouts.

Thirty Spanish senators called on the Chinese government on Tuesday to allow the Panchen Lama to exercise his fundamental freedom in accordance with the PRC's international commitments and call for the immediate release of the Panchen Lama, his family and all other Tibetan political prisoners, reported The Tibet Post

The Spanish Senators said. "Tibet remains the third least free country in the world tied with Syria and South Sudan. Tibet has been under the tight control of China for more than six decades. This type of repressive regime is best exemplified by the case of the Panchem Lama".

"We call on the Chinese authorities to allow him to fully exercise his fundamental freedoms, as established in the international commitments of the Chinese


Communist Party. And we call for the prompt release of Gedhun Choekyi Nyima and his parents, immediately and unconditionally, together with all Tibetan political prisoners," the Senators added.

Inter-Parliamentary Group for Tibet in the Spanish Senate demanded China provide proof of life and account for his whereabouts, reported Central Tibetan Administration. The inter-parliamentary group for Tibet in the Senate was established and launched earlier in February this year at the initiative of Senator Robert Masih Nahar, and this is one of its first political activities.

US Republican Senator Jim McGovern also called the Chinese government to release Gedhun Choekyi Nyima. "On his 34th birthday, I call on the Chinese government to release Gedhun Choekyi Nyima--the Panchen Lama--one of the highest positions in Tibetan Buddhism. Tibetans deserve to venerate their leaders without interference, and he and his family should be released immediately," tweeted McGovern.

Exercise Orion 23: Indian male, female IAF warriors take part in multinational wargame

n a first, both female and male Indian Air Force warriors are taking part in the ongoing multinational wargame Exercise 'Orion' at Mont-de-Marsan in France. The multinational wargame codenamed 'Orion' is being hosted by France involving many of its NATO and other important allies.

Taking to Twitter, Indian Air Force on Wednesday said, "Busy Minds, Busier Skies! A detailed pre-flight brief is as important as the flight itself. #IAF Air Warriors busy planning their routines during the ongoing #ExOrion 23." France and India began a military exercise 'Orion' at Mont-de-Marsan, an Air Force base of the French Air and Space Force (FASF) on April 17.

Taking to Twitter, France Ambassador Emmanuel Lenain earlier said, "France warmly welcomes the @IAF MCC contin-

gent that will take part in exercise #Orion2023 from today! French & Indian #Rafale jets will soon fly together in the skies of France.'

The exercise is being conducted from April 17 to May 5, 2023, with the IAF Contingent comprising four Rafale, two C-17, two 11-78 aircraft and 165 air warriors. This is the first overseas exercise for the IAF's Rafale aircraft, according to the statement released by Defence Ministry.

"Besides the IAF and the FASF, Air Forces from Germany, Greece, Italy, the Netherlands, the United Kingdom, Spain and the United States would also be flying in this multilateral exercise. Participation in this exercise would further enrich the employment philosophy of the India Air Force, by imbibing the best practices from other Air Forces," the statement read.

360 Indians leave Jeddah under 'Operation Kaveri' on New Delhi-bound flight

s 'Operation Kaveri' continues, 360 Indians left Jeddah Airport on a flight bound for New Delhi and will soon be reunited with their families, the Union Minister of State for External Affairs V Muraleedharan said on Wednesday.

As the fighting between the Sudanese Army and paramilitary groups intensified in the capital Khartoum, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar informed on Monday that its 'Operation Kaveri' to evacuate its citizens from battle-torn Sudan is underway.

Operation Kaveri is a rescue operation launched by the central government to evacuate stranded Indian citizens from Sudan. "Happy to see off 360 Indians at Jeddah Airport in a flight bound for New Delhi They will be reaching the motherland soon, reuniting with their families Under #Operation-Kaveri the Government is working relentlessly to evacuate Indian nationals from Sudan & bring



them home safely," MoS Muraleedharan tweeted.

India has deployed its military planes and warships to rescue Indians from there.

Sudan is experiencing bloodshed as a result of clashes between the army and paramilitary forces. Even though there is a 72-hour ceasefire, there have been allegations of violence.

Fighting has erupted between soldiers loyal to Sudanese army leader Abdel Fattah al-Burhan and his deputy, paramilitary Rapid Support Soldiers (RSF) commander Mohamed Hamdan Daglo.

The evacuation operation started in Port Sudan, Till now, an estimated 300-500 Indian citizens have been evacuated by ship and other evacuation processes are going on. The government sources also stated that the INS Teg is stationed at Port Sudan to bring back Indians from there to Jeddah.

Earlier, the INS Sumedha has already disembarked 278 Indians from there to Jeddah.t

Delhi International Art Festival Makes a Splash

here are some art festivals in India that are iconic and every artist looks forward to being a part of it either as a participant or as an audience. Delhi International Art Festival (DIAF) is one for sure that everyone awaits eagerly. For the last few years due to Covid the festival did not take place and finally it did come back for the art lovers and what a splash it made, that it mesmerised one and all. I spoke with the very elated festival curator and director Padmashree Prathibha Prahlad and this is what she said, excerpts from the interview:

Chit..chat...

Back with a bang, after covid, how do vou feel?

This year's Delhi International Arts Festival was nothing short of magic. It had divine blessings. Though talks were on about getting the Festival back since April 2022, things were not definite and funding was in huge doubt. It was only in November that we got a go-ahead for the Festival. I was overjoyed and I am glad it all fell into place and we could get DIAF to the audience. I am glad honourable Minister of State for External Affairs Ms. Meenakshi Lekhi and Honourable Ms. Maneka Gandhi came to support us along with many

I believe DIAF had interesting themes this year, please explain?

Yes, the festival this year was thematic with the three broad themes a) our epics and cultural treasures b) unsung heroes and heroines of the freedom struggle c) policies of the current Govt. that effect change in environment and ecology, not polluting the rivers, nurturing the girl child, and such like.

The venue was magical isn't it?

When Kartavya Path was decided as the main venue, the excitement was palpable. We never knew how challenging it was going to be or how expensive it would be to mount a huge festival for full 15 days in the two open air amphi-theatres of Katavyapath. There was only one thought on my mind. DIAF had reached India Gate and we had to do the best possible with the very meagre funds we had to ensure that our arts and our cultural legacy got a pride of place in our polity and



engaged, educated and entertained the masses and those not exposed to our arts in a meaningful manner. I think we accomplished this because we had overflowing audiences every single evening and people seemed to thrilled that DIAF exposed to them to our invaluable artistic

During Covid, many festivals went online but you choose not to, why?

I believe that performing arts have to have to be live and have a live audience for lasting impact. Editing videos, putting out 2-10 minute pieces online, trying to get maximum viewership and likes, fabricating numbers, pretending that online presence and number of likes was actual and real is all a mis-representation and a lie. To me, DIAF is a passion to engage and educate people about the depth, diversity and the invaluable wealth

of India's intangible heritage- not just a festival to earn money. I detest online dance videos and did not involve myself in anything to do with it - be they my own performances or

As always DIAF rocked, which was the most favourite part of the show for you?

The Festival really did Rock and How!!! Like I mentioned, the engagement was phenomenal, the whole place looked like paradise and I kept looking at our stage and backdrop and thinking the stars were dropping down from Heaven. There were many extraordinary performances, but my productions Walking with the Mahatma and Warrior Women of Bharat were truly special and got huge standing

What was the highlight of this year's show?

There were exceptional productions based on epics-like Java Ram by Sutra Dance Company and Sri Ramayan by Pavitra Bhatt, Rasa United's Trayambakam, Prasiddha Repertory's Ekam Sat, Kathastra by Prabhat Group, theatrical productions like Veer Abhimanyu, Chavundaraya, Bacchi, productions on India's Freedom Struggle like Warrior Women of Bharat, Samarpan by Pulakeshi Kasturi's group, Rudramma by Alekhya Punjala's group etc., productions on environment & water preservation like A drop to the Ocean by Meera Das, Earth Diaries by Gauri Diwakar, Rivers to Reverse by Sruti Gopal, Guhya by Poornima Gururaj, productions on the girl child such as Ma Mujhe To Jeene Do by Shovana Narayan's group, Su-Shakti & others.

How difficult was it to get the show back on ground?

The number one difficulty is adequate funding. While the Government and Corporates spend crores on meaningless festivals with hundreds dancing or other such events, they do not grant adequate funds to a Festival that projects India in a strategic manner and brands it as a cultural super power on the world stage such as DIAF. I cannot understand why, even after 15 years of consistent and top quality work, we should struggle for grants and sponsorships every year. So, every year, it is a huge challenge to match the money we have with the visibility and expectations that people all over the world in culture have of DIAF. The second is a committed and talented office that knows administration of culture. Culture administration is a specialist's job, not everyone can easily manage that. It has been a real challenge to train people every year. I am praying that our Prime Minister intervenes and sets this right so that there is a course correct in arts administration by the Government machinery.
