Congress leader Rahul Gandhi to contest from Amethi, confirms Uttar Pradesh's party chief in Lok Sabha polls 2024



Congress leader Rahul Gandhi, who was defeated in the 2019 general election by BJP's Smriti Irani, is all set to contest the 2024 Lok Sabha elections from Amethi in Uttar Pradesh. Newly elected Uttar Pradesh Congress chief Ajay Rai confirmed that Rahul Gandhi will contest the 2024 Lok Sabha elections from Amethi.

"Rahul Gandhi will contest from Amethi in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections," Ajay Rai said. "It is the demand of the Congress

workers and the public there...Congress workers want to work on their shortcomings to make sure Rahul Gandhi wins from Amethi. Congress workers demand that Priyanka Gandhi be established as a strong leader. It is their (Sonia Gandhi, Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi) personal decision on where to contest from. We will give our best performance to ensure their win," he said.

"I am standing in front of you. The rest is to the party high command and INDIA

bloc to decide," said Ajay Rai on being asked if he will again contest against PM Modi in the Varanasi constituency. Ajay Rai was the Congress candidate in Varanasi both in 2014 and 2019 and lost to Prime Minister Narendra Modi. On speculations of Priyanka Gandhi contesting in the 2024 election, Rai said that Priyanka Gandhi will contest from wherever she wants to. "If Priyanka Gandhi wishes to contest from Varanasi, every worker would strive to make her win," he added. Meanwhile,

Congress leader Bhakt Charan Das said that Rahul Gandhi has started a revolution.

"Such a spotless character will win. It doesn't matter where he fights the elections. Even if Rahul Gandhi fights from Manipur, he will win," he said. However, Uttar Pradesh minister Dinesh Pratap Singh said that "Currently nobody can break the faith and the trust people have in PM Modi."

He said that Ajay Rai is giving a statement to gain cheap popularity. He has only tried to establish himself in the media. ANI

Gender Stereotypes

In a welcome initiative, the Supreme Court has unveiled a handbook that aims to help the judges and members of the legal community identify, understand and counteract harmful stereotypes about women in the legal discourse.

The alternatives are an eye-opener: 'sex worker' instead of 'hooker' or 'prostitute'; 'street sexual harassment' rather than 'eve-teasing'; 'bastard' to be replaced by 'non-marital child' or 'a child whose parents were not married'; and 'homemaker' instead of 'housewife'.

Raising the pitch for gender equality, the handbook cites the Constitution which guarantees equal rights to individuals of all genders to counter the stereotype that women should be submissive or subordinate to men. The Supreme Court must be commended for this thoughtful step, whose importance cannot be over emphasised in our predominantly patriarchal society. At the same time, the SC needs to pay greater attention to gender diversity in the higher judiciary, considering the low proportion of women judges in the Supreme Court and high courts.

Will justice really be achieved by calling punishment as justice?

The famous concept of criminal justice system is-'Nature of crime shows the pathology of society'. Same IPC, same CrPC and same evidence law, but the conviction rate in Kerala is 85.6% while in Bihar it is 6.5% (as per NCRB report). The problem will not be solved by changing the name of India to India or the name of punishment in law. Yes, the parameters of individual liberty expand over time. In the context of new concepts regarding gender equality, physical relations, it is expedient to bring some new laws or remove the old ones and also comply with the order of Cotter. There is no doubt that 160 years ago the socio-ethical values were different and in such a situation the power of the state was more dominant as opposed to civil liberties but in 70 years of democracy its philosophy has changed. Now the names of IPC, CrPC and Evidence Act will also be Indian Judicial Code, Indian Civil Defense Code and Indian Evidence Act respectively. Expressing concern over the reduction in the rate of conviction, the Home Minister asked to increase it to 90% and for this, there has also been talk of arranging for extensive help of forensic science in research. But all this is not as simple as it appears.

To all parents and even grandparents, as well as teachers, here are some unbelievably simple parenting ideas that work.

US court denies Mumbai terror attacks accused Tahawwur Rana's plea against extradition to India

A US court has denied the writ of habeas corpus filed by Pakistani-origin Canadian businessman Tahawwur Rana, paving the way for US Secretary of State Antony Blinken to issue a certification for him to be extradited to India where he is sought for his involvement in the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks. In a major victory for India's fight in bringing the perpetrators of the 26/11 Mumbai attacks to justice, a US court approved 62-year-old Rana's extradition to India in May.

In June this year, Rana, who is currently detained at the Metropolitan Detention Centre in Los Angeles, filed a "writ of habeas corpus" challenging the court order that acceded to the request of the US government that the 2008 Mumbai terror attacks accused

be extradited to India. "The court has denied Tahawwur Rana's petition for writ of habeas corpus

by a separate order," Judge Dale S Fischer, United States District Judge, Central District of California, wrote in his order on August 10.

However, Rana has filed an appeal against the order and sought a stay on his extradition to India till the time his appeal in the Ninth Circuit Court is heard. Rana faces charges for his role in the Mumbai attacks and is known to be associated with Pakistani-American terrorist David Coleman Headley, one of the main conspirators of the 26/11 Mumbai attacks. 300 meters long Skywalk for Bandra-Kurla Complex



Mumbai, Kurla records huge influx of floating population daily. However, the roads of Kurla are heavily congested, due to which pedestrians face inconvenience for reaching the station during peak hours. Therefore, a 300-metre-

long skywalk has been proposed to connect Taximen's Colony near Bandra-Kurla Complex in Mumbai's Kurla (west) with the Shree Krishna Chowk, near Kurla station. The skywalk will be 4.25 meters wide and 300 meters long. It will be built using ar-

moured steel and is also expected to have escalators for the convenience of pedestrians. At present, pedestrians reach the station by walking through the Lal Bahadur Shastri (LBS) Marg. For its proximity to BKC, which is a major commercial hub,

The work order for the project was issued in August 2021. However, the construction works are yet to begin. Civic officials said that the work will begin immediately after monsoon this year and it will be completed by June 2024. There are several underground functions that fall in the alignment of the proposed skywalk.

The officials told Afternoon Voice "we are working on all the probabilities and trying to make skywalk open for people".

ITMS to be functional from October 15 this year

The Intelligent Traffic Management System (ITMS) project being carried out by the Maharashtra State Road Development Corporation (MSRDC) on the Mumbai-Pune New Expressway is in completion stage and will likely be completed by October 15. "We are planning to make the ITMS functional from October 15 this year,"

said Sanjay Yadav, Joint Managing Director, MSRDC. In fact, in Maharashtra, the ITMS project will be the first of its kind once functional on the Mumbai-Pune New Expressway. MSRDC looks after the expressway. The project aims to enhance the management and safety of the expressway through the use of advanced technologies and intelligent cameras.

the victim — Dinesh Rathod — on the railway track, leading to his death. Police said that the deceased had initially bumped into the woman accidentally at Sion railway station, following which the couple hit him and he fell on the railway track. Later, he was run over by a speeding train.

Fake call centre busted in Gurgaon; 10 held



Ten people, including a woman, were arrested, and cash amounting to Rs 10 lakh recovered in Gurgaon's sector 43 on Wednesday, police said.

According to police, "On the intervening night of Wednesday and Thursday, police were informed that a fraudulent call centre was operating from a house in sector 43 which was deceiving

foreign citizens under the pretext of providing customer service.

During the raid, it was found that the operators were allegedly cheating foreign citizens by posing as technical support providers. An FIR under IPC sections 420, 204, 120B IPC and 66, 66D, 75 IT Act were registered.

According to police, the accused on questioning revealed that the call centre has been op-

erating since August last year. They allegedly used virtual TFN numbers, which were used to redirect calls, and incoming calls were monitored by the employees. When customers faced issues related to Amazon, PayPal, eBay, they were directed to these virtual numbers. The callers posed as representatives of these companies, gained the customers' trust, and remotely accessed their systems using applications like Anydesk and TeamViewer, police said. The scammers deceived customers by fabricating various problems and then charged them between USD 100 and 500 to resolve the issues. The scammed amount was transferred to various IDs, and then converted to cash through blockchain, with the scammers receiving incentives based on the fraudulently obtained funds, police added.

Police confiscated three mobile phones, 10 laptops, a modem, and Rs 10 lakh in cash.

Himachal CM calls for setting up more Automatic Weather Stations



Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister on Thursday directed officials to work on a plan to set up more Automatic Weather Stations (AWS) in the state to obtain real-time data related to weather forecasts.

At present, there are 23 AWS stations in several places in the state including Shimla, Dharamshala, Dalhousie and Kufri.

Presiding over a high-level meeting held here late Wednesday evening, Sukhu directed the concerned departments to take appropriate steps to increase the number of AWS and stressed for setting up a weather observatory centre in the state, a statement issued here on Thursday said.

Oppn accuses K'taka govt of releasing Cauvery water to TN to save INDIA bloc ahead of LS polls

Taking strong exception to the Karnataka government's decision to release Cauvery river water to Tamil Nadu, opposition BJP and JD(S) have accused the Congress dispensation of 'betraying' the people of the state and its farmers for the sake of politics and to save its INDIA bloc ahead of the 2014 Lok Sabha polls.

Tamil Nadu's ruling DMK is a major part of the opposition bloc. While BJP leader and former Chief Minister Basavaraj Bommai said

politics seems to have taken priority over the state's interest, another former CM and JD(S) leader H D Kumaraswamy alleged that the Siddaramaiah administration has not taken the people and opposition into confidence on the issue.

Clarifying that he never tried to politicise the Cauvery river water issue, Bommai, targeting Deputy Chief Minister D K Shivakumar for making such allegations against him, said the Congress government was mixing politics. PTI

Rescue operations have helped evacuate over 2,000 people in Himalaya

Over 2,000 people in the last 3 days across Himachal Pradesh, which has been battered by incessant rains, leading to flash floods and landslides. The death toll climbed up to 74 as another body was pulled out of the rubble of a Shiva temple in Shimla and two more people were killed in the Chamba district.

What is the situation now? Rescue operations are still on. Principal Secretary (Revenue), Onkar Chand Sharma, said that the losses in the monsoon season have touched Rs 7,500 crore. As many as 650 roads were blocked in the state and 1,135 transformers and 285 water supply schemes



were disrupted. Since the onset of the monsoon on June 24, 217 persons have died in rain-related incidents in Himachal Pradesh.

How long will it take to rebuild? Chief Minister Sukhvir Singh Sukhu has said that the

state will take a year to rebuild the infrastructure damaged by the heavy rains this monsoon and claimed that the estimated loss in the two devastating spells of heavy rains — this week and in July — is about Rs 10,000 crore.

Traffic movement will be restricted on DSC (Dadri-Surajpur-Chhalera) road from Sector 37 to New Ashok Nagar border and from New Ashok

Nagar border to Sector 37 from 11 am to 3 pm. Traffic will be stopped on Noida-Greater Noida Expressway for a short period in both directions. Traffic police said that the commuters, coming from Delhi, are advised to enter Noida via Kondli and the traffic going towards Delhi have been diverted to Shashi Chowk, Spice Chowk, Stadium Chowk, Jhundurpura Chowk towards its destination via Kondli.

Karnataka govt to provide security to writers who received 'threat letters'

Karnataka Home Minister G Parameshwara on Thursday said a group of writers and intellectuals in the state have written to him saying they have received threats to their life, following which steps are being taken to provide security to them.

Accordingly, directions have

been issued to Director General of Police Alok Mohan and Bengaluru Police Commissioner B Dayananda to provide security to the writers and intellectuals.

According to the information received, over 15 writers and intellectuals from the state have written to Parameshwara, stating that they have been receiving

threat letters for the past one year and sought time to meet him.

They also said that they received letters saying that they will meet the fate of late activists M M Kalburgi and Gauri Lankesh. The two were shot dead by a fringe right wing group during the tenure of previous BJP government. PTI

US intelligence says, 'Ukraine will not be able to meet counteroffensive's key goal'



The US intelligence community believes that Ukraine's counteroffensive won't succeed in reaching the important southeastern city of Melitopol. If this assessment turns out to be accurate, Kyiv won't achieve its main goal of severing Russia's land bridge to Crimea in this year's push, The Washington Post reported. The assessment is based on Russia's brutal proficiency in defending

occupied territory through a phalanx of minefields and trenches, and it's likely to lead to finger-pointing in Kyiv and Western capitals over why a counteroffensive that involved tens of billions of dollars-worth of weapons and military hardware from the West failed to achieve its objectives.

US officials stated that the Ukrainian forces, which are approaching Melitopol from the town of Robotyne, more than 50

miles away, will stay a distance away from the city. In order to discuss classified military activities, The Washington Post interviewed US, Western, and Ukrainian government officials under the condition of anonymity. The US Directorate of National Intelligence declined to make any comments. Since Melitopol is regarded as the entry point to Crimea, it is essential to Ukraine's counteroffensive. Two significant highways, a railway line, and the city's location at their intersection allow Russia to transport military soldiers and equipment from the peninsula to other seized areas in southern Ukraine.

US officials predict that Ukraine's attempt to reclaim Russian-occupied territory would falter before it reaches Melitopol, a crucial city in the southeast. The village of Robotyne is now being pushed south by Ukrainian soldiers. ANI

Pakistan's caretaker PM Kakar said, "Interim govt won't support 'forces of darkness'"



Pakistan's caretaker Prime Minister Anwaarul Haq Kakar on Friday said the interim government would not support "the forces of darkness" in the society as he took strong exception to the unprecedented attack on minority Christians in the Muslim-majority country's Punjab province. An enraged mob ransacked and torched 21 churches and 35 homes of Christians on Wednesday over

blasphemy allegations in Jaranwala town of Faisalabad district, 130 km from Lahore, the provincial capital. "The minorities will stay protected in this country. There may be an attempt to harm them from a section of marginalised and peripheral groups of people, but that would be responded to sternly and strictly," Kakar said during his maiden federal Cabinet meeting. PTI

Activist says, "Baloch is targeting Chinese to protect their land and identity"

Days after a convoy of Chinese engineers was attacked in Pakistan's southwestern province of Balochistan, a prominent Baloch activist justified the incident calling it an attempt by the indigenous people to protect their identity and land. Hakeem Baloch, a journalist and a senior activist of the Baloch National Movement (BNM) based in the UK, told ANI that China has been investing heavily in the region for its own economic and military interests.

He said, "The Chinese investment is not for the Baloch people, it's in reality, not even for the Punjab (a province in Pakistan). What China is looking for is Gwadar Port. China wants to strengthen its military power, China wants to strengthen its military growth in the region by controlling the Gwadar port." "If China controls Gwadar port, they can control the Middle East from there. And with that China will become a regional power. For the people of Balochistan, there is

nothing in these huge projects", he said.

Gwadar, a seaport town in Balochistan is witnessing developmental projects as part of the multi-billion-dollar China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) project. A large number of Chinese engineers are engaged in projects financed by the Chinese government. Hakeem said that these development projects are not benefiting the indigenous Baloch and they are getting poorer. But, at this very moment when the Baloch are a slave and Balochistan is under slavery when the lives of people in Balochistan are miserable, when the stories of people of Balochistan is about death, sorrows and brutality, how one can imagine coming to Balochistan and they can live a life which the locals can't imagine". Nashville shooter manifesto? Yes, we can handle the truth. Just give me the hard truth," Ramaswamy went on to say.

On the heels of Carlson's comment that it feels like the country is on a "cusp of chaos," Ramaswamy said, "there's something going on."

"We're like in a 1775 – spring of 1776 moment," Ramaswamy described the current energy in the country. ANI
