EN'S RESERV ALLOWS GREAT RESENTATION TO WOM

he Women's Reservation Bill has been pending for the past 27 years. NDA under the leadership PM Narendra Modi it is being realised. With the implementation of Women's Reservation Bill, Maharashtra will have 95 women legislators in the 288-member state legislative Assembly. The current strength of women MLAs in the Assembly adds up to only 24. The Congress has the second-highest number of women legislators in the Maharashtra Assembly. Out of 44 Congress MLAs, five are women NCP, with a total of 54 MLAs, has three women members; while Shiv Sena's Shinde faction with 40 MLAs has two women legislators. Shiv Sena (UBT) faction led by Uddhav Thackeray has only one-woman MLA out of its 16

legislators. Apart from the mainstream parties, there are two women independents. After the 2019 Assembly elections, the BJP with 105 MLAs has brought the maximum number of women legislators (12) to the House. The demise of Mukta Tilak (Kasbapeth) last year, however, brought down the strength of BJP women legislators to 11.

The Centre's offer to implement 33 per cent reservation to women in Lok Sabha and state Legislative Assemblies has been welcomed unanimously by all parties setting aside their ideological differences. Earlier, women voter turnout was less between 1960s and 1980s. Later, from 1980s to 2019, the women vote bank has become crucial for elections. The role of deploying women workers to reach out to households as part of campaign is now a mainstay of election exercise.

Apart from political parties, Election Commission has also launched the voting awareness drive that resulted in large number of women coming to polling booths in the last two decades. Yet, when it comes to the number of women in Cabinet, the representation is bleak. Aditi Tatkare is the lone woman minister in the Eknath Shinde government that has a total of 27 ministers. The total permissible strength of state cabinet is 43 ministers, including CM. In July 2023, when the NCP faction under Ajit Pawar joined the government led by BJP and Shiv Sena (Shinde faction), 36 out of 54 NCP MLAs switched to the rebel group. Subsequently, Aditi Tatkare, NCP MLA from Shrivardhan, got a Cabinet berth. Both BJP and Shiv Sena (Shinde faction) have promised to bring in woman ministers in the next cabinet expansion.

Maharashtra, known for its leadership and progressive characters, has never had a woman chief minister ever since its formation in 1960. The previous state governments have ensured at least one, two or three women ministers in the cabinet depending on the coalition, although their representation has always been low. The Maha Vikas Aghadi government (2019 to 2022) comprising Congress, NCP, and Shiv Sena led by former chief minister Uddhav Thackeray had three women ministers - Varsha Gaikwad and Yashomati Thakur from the Congress and Aditi Tatkare from NCP. In 1994, the then chief minister Sharad Pawar came out with its first comprehensive women empowerment policy. The state also took the lead to support 50 per cent reservation to women in local bodies.

anada is a hub of Sikh separatists; all the plans are made there and unrest is created on Indian soil. Hardeep Singh Nijjar, was shot dead in Canada on June 18th. Pannun and Nijjar used to work together and had visited Australia, besides other countries, to launch the Khalistan Referendum campaign. Gurpatwant Singh Pannun, who would usually take credit for terror-related incidents in India, has been silent about the killings, besides the mysterious death of Avtar Singh Khanda. Pannun even halted his propaganda after Nijjar was shot dead and has not released any audio/video since then. Nijjar was shot as he was leaving the parking lot of the Gurudwara where he served as president in British Columbia. He suffered multiple gunshot wounds and died at the spot.

The World Sikh Organisation of Canada alleged the role of Indian intelligence agencies in Hardeep Singh Nijjar's murder. It asked Canadian intelligence and law enforcement agencies to "fully investigate the assassination of Hardeep Singh Nijjar, including the role of foreign interference, specifically from India". It is not only Pannun, but several other Khalistani exponents and terrorists, based in the UK, US, Canada, Australia and Pakistan, who have gone into hiding after the spate of deaths.

The NIA has issued lookout notices against dozens of Khalistani radicals, including Arshdeep Singh alias Arsh Dala, Gagandeep Singh, Goldy Brar, Gurpinder Singh, Satveer Singh, Charnjeet Singh and Ramandeep Singh. Most of them are hiding in Canada. Nearly a week after Nijjar's slaying, about 200 protesters from Canada's Sikh community gathered in front of the Indian Consulate in Vancouver to demonstrate. Many of the protesters were convinced that Nijjar's killing was linked to his calls for an independent Sikh state.

In 2016, Indian media reported that Nijjar was suspected of masterminding a bombing in the Sikh-majority State of Punjab and training terrorists in a small city southeast of Vancouver. Last year, Indian authorities accused Nijjar of involvement in an alleged attack on a Hindu priest in India and announced a reward of about \$16,000 for information leading to his arrest. The modern Sikh independence movement reaches back to the 1940s but eventually became an armed insurgency that shook the country in the 1970s and 1980s. In 1984, then-Prime Minister Indira Gandhi ordered a raid to capture armed separatists taking refuge in Sikh's holiest shrine.

The raid killed hundreds of people, and two of Gandhi's Sikh bodyguards assassinated her shortly after. In response, anti-Sikh riots took place across India in which members of the minority were dragged out of their homes and killed. The insurgency was eventually suppressed in a crackdown during which thousands of people were killed, but the goal of Sikh independence still has support among some in northern India and in the Sikh diaspora.

More recently, Prime Minister Narendra Modi government has cracked down on both non-Hindu rights movements and



dissidents. Sikh diaspora activism has been a source of tension between India and Canada for years. Canada has the largest population of Sikhs outside India, and India has repeatedly accused it of tolerating "terrorists and extremists". At present in India, there is no Khalistan movement, nor it will be in coming future. Most of Sikh's are patriotic as 20% of them are in Indian army. This Khalistan movement is created by few radical Sikh extremists on foreign land and they are still continuing to do so but the reality is that, they will never get separate Khalistan, the extremists will come and go but they will not be able to get inch of separate land in the name of Khalistan.

It's high time these Sikh separatists should utilize their energy in some constructive work that will benefit the entire humanity, this is the ideal way of life that a Sikh is supposed to live. The Langar practice (distribution of free food in the community kitchen of Gurudwra) is a living example of that tradition. Stay alert for Fatal Virus

Seven leopard cubs at the Bannerghatta National Park have died between August 22 and September 5, owing to the outbreak of Feline panleukopenia, a viral disease that is usually spread through cats. Surprisingly, all the cubs were vaccinated. In rare cases, there is a vaccination failure. It is also possible that the virus might have mutated, making the vaccine ineffective.

This is the first time a Feline panleukopenia outbreak has occurred at Bannerghatta National Park. While the exact cause is unknown, the authorities suspect that it might have spread from animal keepers who have pet cats. Following the outbreak, the authorities have sanitised the entire area and have put in place precautionary measures. "It is similar to Covid, distancing measures are the key. We have sanitised the area and asked the doctors and animal keepers to take precautionary measures, the situation is now under control" Sen said.

Man dies of electrocution on shooting sets of a serial in goregaon

Rs 50 lakh compensation should be given to the next kin of the deceased and the resignation of the Managing Director and Labor Commissioner of Film City should be taken with immediate effect," he said. Women's Reservation Bill: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi says, "Delimitation and census not required..." for its implementation



ongress leader Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday said that census and delimitation is not required for implementing the Women's Reservation Bill and it should come into force soon after it is passed by Parliament. Participating in the debate on the Bill in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi said that it should also have provision for OBC reservation.

"There is one thing in my view that makes this bill incom-

plete. I would like to have seen the OBC reservation included in this bill," he said. Supporting the bill, Rahul Gandhi also raised the party's demand for caste census and said that the population of Dalits, tribals and Other Backward Classes can only be known through it.

Referring to the concerns raised by opposition parties about the provisions of the bill, he said that it legislation can be implemented without delay. "Delimitation and census is not required, the bill should be immediately implemented," the Congress leader said. **ANI**

AIMIM chief slams centre, opposes women's reservation bill



IMIM MP Asaduddin Owaisi on Wednesday opposed the women's reservation bill saying it would provide reservation only to "savarna women", and questioned why OBC and Muslim women who have even lesser representation in Parliament are not being given any quota. "I oppose this legislation.... The justification that is being given for the bill is

to Parliament. If that is the justification, why that justification is not being extended to the OBC and Muslim women whose representation in this august House is minimal," Owaisi said. "We know Muslim women are seven per cent of the population, but in this Lok Sabha their representation stands at only 0.7 per cent," he said. Union Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal introduced the Constitution amendment bill which seeks to reserve 33 per cent seats in the Lok Sabha and state Assemblies for women in the Lower House of Parliament on Wednesday. CM Sukhu says, "Result of HPSSC-conducted exams will be declared in 3 months"

he results of examinations conducted by the erstwhile Himachal Pradesh Staff Selection Commission (HPSSC) whose papers were not leaked and sold would be declared within three months, Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said in the Assembly on Wednesday. Leak of question papers of 14 examinations conducted by the commission has been



confirmed and 65 people have been arrested, he said, replying to a question on unemployment in the state during the Question Hour. Investigations into these leaks are in progress, he said. Refuting the allegation of the opposition that the government was cheating the youth in the name of employment, Sukhu retorted that question papers were leaked and sold during the erstwhile BJP government, but the present government scrapped the commission after cases of leak and selling of papers surfaced. **PTI**

"Without revolution, evolution is not possible. For evolution to take place in our country, it is very important that women from OBC, SC and minorities get reservation...," she said in the Parliament. ANI

Nipah Virus: Kerala Health Minister says," No new cases reported in last four days"



erala Health Minister Veena George on Wednesday said that no new cases of the Nipah virus have been reported in the last four days in the state. Addressing reporters in Kerala's Thiruvananthapuram, George said, "No new Nipah cases have been reported in the last four days in the state. Out of the 323 samples tested, 317 samples tested negative and six samples tested positive till now. 11 persons in isolation and

their test results are negative".

"We have decided to strengthen the healthcare system. We have started to strengthen the 'One Health' activities in the district. We have started training people for the same. 'One health' means all the departments will come together. We have also taken the decision to establish an institution where all the departments will be well-coordinated. So, community surveillance will be there throughout the year", she added. ANI

Russia calls for immediate stop to 'Bloodshed' over ongoing tensions between Nagorno-Karabakh region



ussia has called for an immediate halt to "bloodshed" in the ongoing conflict in the Nagorno-Karabakh region and has urged Azerbaijan and Armenia to return to compliance with the trilateral agreement with Moscow, TASS News Agency reported. Moscow has further urged the sides to stop armed hostilities and do everything possible to protect the population.

"The most important thing

now is to immediately return to compliance with the trilateral agreements signed at the top level in 2020-2022, which lay out all measures for a peaceful solution to the Nagorno-Karabakh issue," the Russian Foreign Ministry said in a statement. It also urged "to stop armed hostilities and to do everything possible in order to protect the population of Nagorno-Karabakh and defend its interests," TASS reported. It further demanded the sides to stop the 'bloodshed', adding that the Russian peacekeeping force is assisting the civilian population in the conflicted region.

"Due to a rapid escalation of armed hostilities in Nagorno-Karabakh, we strongly call upon the conflicting sides to immediately stop bloodshed, cease hostilities and prevent casualties among the civilian population," TASS quoted the Russian Foreign Ministry. It added, "Currently, the Russian peacekeeping force is assisting the civilian population [of Nagorno-Karabakh], including providing medical aid to them, and is dealing with matters of evacuation".

Meanwhile, at least 27 people have been killed and 200 wounded in a military operation by Azerbaijan in the disputed Nagorno-Karabakh region, CNN reported citing an official in Armenian-controlled territory there.

Cyberattack case: International criminal court says. "hackers accessed its systems"

The International Criminal Court (ICC) has said it experienced a cyberattack last week after hackers accessed its internal systems, TechCrunch reported. TechCrunch is an American global online newspaper focusing on high-tech and startup companies.

The ICC, headquartered in The Hague, Netherlands, is the only permanent war crimes tribunal. Established in 2002, the court is currently investigating crimes against humanity in Ukraine. On Tuesday, the ICC confirmed that it had detected "anomalous activity affecting its information systems." The ICC said in a post on X, formerly Twitter: "Immediate measures were adopted to respond to this cybersecurity incident and to mitigate its impact."

"Additional response and security measures are now ongoing, with the assistance of the

Host Country authorities," he said, referring to the Netherlands.

The nature of the incident remains unclear and it's not yet known whether any data held on the ICC's systems was accessed or exfiltrated. ICC spokesperson Fadi El-Adballah declined to answer TechCrunch's questions and said the organization would not be commenting beyond its statement. The impact on the ICC's operation is also not yet known. In its statement, the court said it "continues to analyze and mitigate the impact of the incident" adding that "priority is being given to ensuring that the core work of the Court continues". "The Court is thankful to the Host Country for the excellent cooperation and the immediate response and support provided in relation to this incident," the statement said. ANI

Indian student death case: City Council asks Seattle Police to review a policy over involvement in the conflict



he Seattle Police Department has said that they will review a policy that allows a police union official to be involved in an investigation of a rank-and-file officer they represent and defend, a potential conflict of interest that has emerged following the tragic death of Indian student Jaahnavi Kandula. Kandula, 23, was struck and killed by Officer Kevin Dave on the night of January 23 when his overspeeding patrol vehicle

hit her. As part of the investigation, Officer Daniel Auderer, a certified drug-recognition expert, and the elected vice president of the Seattle Police Officers Guild (SPOG), was called from home to perform field sobriety tests on Dave at the West Precinct. "It was very obvious to me that Dave was not impaired and safe to operate a motor vehicle," Auderer concluded after conducting a series of observations and tests recorded in his report. PTI

Canadian PM's remark over involvement in killing of a sikh leader, allies divided: report

day after Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau Alleged India's involvement in the killing of a prominent Sikh separatist leader, the Canadian media reported that Ottawa's Five Eye allies were not keen on taking sides though they have said that the claims should be thoroughly probed. Hardeep Singh Nijjar, 45, the chief of the banned Khalistan Tiger Force (KTF) and one of India's mostwanted terrorists who carried a cash reward of Rs 10 lakh on his head, was shot dead by two unidentified gunmen outside a gurdwara in Surrey in the western Canadian province of British Columbia on June 18. Canadian Prime Minister Trudeau told the House of Commons on Monday that he waited until he was able to raise the issue with allies and with India's Prime Minister Narendra Modi on the sidelines of the G20 summit in New Delhi earlier this month before telling



the public about the possible link.

India has dismissed Trudeau's allegation as "absurd and baseless." "We wanted to make sure that we had a solid grounding in understanding what was going on in analysis and indeed in facts. We wanted to make sure we were taking the time to talk with our allies, to share what we knew," The Canadian Press news agency quoted Trudeau on Tuesday.

Canada is part of a 'Five Eyes' network which is an intelligence alliance consisting of the United States, United Kingdom, Austra-

lia, Canada and New Zealand. Trudeau has also said he does not want to make things worse for relations with India. "We are not looking to provoke or escalate. We are simply laying out the facts as we understand them, and we want to work with the government of India to lay everything clear." According to a report by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC), Canada's other Five Eyes allies "showed little inclination Tuesday to wade into an escalating row between Ottawa and New Delhi over allegations. " Most opted to treat the allegation as a matter still to be investigated — in spite of the fact that the Trudeau government feels it has enough information to make an accusation in Parliament and expel a diplomat, it noted. The United States, United Kingdom and Australia have all issued statements calling for the allegations to be thoroughly probed.
