Maratha Quota Violence: CM Eknath Shinde said, "His government was committed to provide reservation"

In the wake of violence in Maharashtra's Jalna district over the Maratha quota demand, Chief Minister Eknath Shinde on Sunday said his government was committed to providing reservation to this community in education and government jobs.

Talking to reporters after attending a state function in Buldhana district, around 450 km from here, he also said that there was no misunderstanding between him and two deputy chief ministers in the state and that all of them were working as a good team.

"My government is committed to giving reservation to the Maratha community in the state. We will not sit quiet until the community get its due reservation," Shinde said. "Till the Maratha community gets reservation, the government schemes that are already in place will continue and deserving people from the Maratha community will benefit from it," he added.

Reservation in jobs and education provided by the state government to the Maratha community was quashed by the

Supreme Court in May 2021, citing the 50 per cent ceiling on total reservations among other grounds. An agitation seeking reservation for the Marathas turned violent at Antarwali Sarathi village in Jalna on Friday, leading to several people, including dozens of police personnel, getting injured. Police resorted to lathi-charge and lobbed tear gas shells to disperse a violent mob that allegedly refused to let authorities shift a man on a hunger strike as part of the quota stir to the hospital. Police registered a case

against more than 360 people in connection with the violence, officials said.

When asked why Deputy Chief Minister Ajit Pawar, who along with eight other Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) MLAs joined his government two months ago, was not present at the event, CM Shinde said, "Ajit Pawar informed me that he is unwell. He is down with fever, while Deputy CM Devendra Fadnavis is in Ladakh to attend a military event." There was no misunderstanding among all three of them, he asserted. **PTI**

o you remember how Prime Minister Narendra Modi promised to create one crore jobs to eradicate youth unemployment in the country. Other countries too have suffered and failed, but not as the Modi government botched citizens on vaccines, testing kits, oxygen, and hospital beds, jobs assurance and above all failed policies, securing jobs for people. This government withered people's survival.

Lack of skill is just a new tool to devalue young aspirants so that they could be hired in way lower salaries than standard one. It's a business. And all blame is put on the education system. Every organisation has their own way of systems and procedures to keep their organisation running. Education will provide you with basics and deep rooted knowledge upon which you can understand and build your skill when you work for organisations. Every organisation equips their employees and new entrants with requisite training to build workable skills. Employers are bosses because they know they are in demand and everyone will bow to them. They said educated youth have no skill, we accepted because they are bosses.

A large percentage of Indians view only Government Jobs as employment. We constantly keep seeing how thousands and lakhs of candidates keep applying for every available Government job — a lot of them are educationally over qualified for the requirement. This scenario is not going to improve, as we have the population growth, equivalent numbers of government jobs are not created. Creating an environment of prosperity and making everyone grow is what we expected from PM's speeches.

Prime Minister talked a lot about the type of these jobs in his concluding speech in the lok sabha no confidence motion held in July. There is no dearth of those kinds of jobs, he means making Pakora and Bhajiya or having tea stalls, but he ignored the fact that how can anyone afford to buy Pakoda and tea if the buyers have no job? Even to run those pakoda stalls they need purchasers. In Spite of having the attitude and open mindedness to take up such jobs, there is no clientele. Small and medium businesses going through tough times are the reason they fail to create jobs, the unorganised sector also limiting the jobs. Modi really needs to get this reality check.

Moreover the developed nations of the world, which are doing well, were earlier totally based on agriculture. India has this huge employment problem because it directly shifted from an agriculture-based economy to a service-based economy, skipping industrialization. With the advent of the industrial revolution, they showed tremen-

dous progress in the manufacturing field. After that, they are slowly switching to the service sector. We don't have an employment policy which is a requirement for all the International Labour Organisation member countries. The government has mainly relied on information technology and special economic zones to create jobs but the real potential lies somewhere else. The Modi government has not only failed to create new jobs but has also failed to keep existing jobs intact. Demonetization has undone every good thing that had happened to our country in the past.

Money flow in the market has decreased since Demonetization and other various factors and its effects are seen slowly now. Therefore Purchasing power of people is reduced, resulting in lower demand for supplies and services. The companies need to produce x amount of goods (food, cars etc.) in a day and should have demand for it. If there is no demand, they tend to produce less than x amount of goods in a day - thereby increasing the production cost, increasing the price and not making profits. To keep the prices and profits balanced, the production is reduced. So eventually companies end up requiring fewer people to produce a decreased amount of goods to keep the balance. This is one of the possible reasons employment in the market has decreased. Other factors that affect this - taxes, subsidies, export! We all have seen how income tax offices are behaving. The Government has not provided the job as required but also decreased jobs in various sectors like Telecom, IT, Construction, Labour, Pharma list is long. Government Sector jobs are on hold due to disputes in courts or due to scams.

Modi just made promises after promises but hardly fulfilled any of them. Whenever youth questioned about the jobs, the government and their machineries diverted the topic showing them danger from Pakistan, how Nehru damaged India, how Ram Mandir was built and most importantly how Hindu is in danger. What can we expect from these brainwashed youth? There is no point in talking about spineless sold out media houses, because they have become the mouthpiece of

Nada Yoga -Vibes and Vibrations



he Sanskrit word Nada translates as sound, tone, or vibration, so Nada Yoga usually means "union through sound," or the "yoga of sound. The ancient Vedic texts say the universe was created as pure vibration. The discussion about different sounds used in Nada Yoga including internal, external and celestial sounds, really interesting. Sound and its influence on consciousness have been a matter of great mystery since the early humans walked on the face of the earth. Experienced, examined, studied and researched by many cultures and civilizations for thousands of years, sound is still a mystery to a great many. The mystics of India have given some of the answers to the questions humanity faces today.

The system is called Nada Yoga (The Yoga of Sound). It is a path of exploration of consciousness through sounds. The aim of the advanced state of Nada Yoga is to purify and harmonize the gross and subtle fields of body energy and bring them in alignment with their natural vibration. It is the opening of a door on the level of highest awareness when consciousness becomes conscious of itself. It is from that state that the transformation and healing begin in a most natural way. All our experiences of love, joy, peace, health and happiness are orchestrated by

consciousness from that field of unified state, the state of Yoga, and are our birthright to enjoy. This healing modality when combined with other methods of natural healing can have profound effects on healing the mind and body.

Nada Yoga is the classical term for the Yoga of Sound in the Hindu tradition. It is a stream of sacred sound that embraces Hatha Yoga, the occult linguistics of Tantra, and the spirituality of classical Indian music. By including the non-linguistic element of music, Nada Brahman augments the Shabda Brahman of the Vedic tradition, as well as the differentiation of energy in the chakras discovered by the Tantrics. While Bhava Yoga chooses only those frequencies that we classify as music in our earthly appreciation of sound, Nada yogis incorporate the full spectrum of frequencies — both those that are audible to the human ear and those that are inaudible — within the field of their yoga practice. This means that all forms of earthly music, the sounds of space, and even the entire electromagnetic spectrum of frequencies are included within this range of perception.

The practice of Nada Yoga can therefore help broaden the consciousness of an audience Western music, since the time of Bach, moved to a tempered set of intervals that divided the octave into twelve equal subdivisions. Prior to this, European musicians used an uneven set of intervals, as did other cultures around the world, which have their own irregular, organic divisions of the octave. The Western ear, trained and conditioned by tempered intervals, came to perceive other music as inferior or out of tune. Only in recent years, with the rapid surge of world music, have ethnic sounds, non-Western musical intervals, variable instrument tunings, and diverse musical scales "enlarged" the Western ear. The power of cultivating a larger ear has never been more necessary than it is now; it will result in a proportionately larger heart, facilitating an authentic acceptance of other cultures and their vibrations.

And someone who has always struggled with traditional meditation, the idea of using sound as a meditation tool is refreshing. The idea of focussing on the subtle sounds is so intriguing and I can't wait to try it out in my own practice.

Yes Bank scam: Special court allows accused Kapil Wadhawan to be shifted to Nashik jail

special court here has allowed the authorities to shift Kapil Wadhawan, an accused in a case related to an alleged scam at Yes Bank, to a prison in Maharashtra's Nashik district after his "misconduct" during multiple hospital visits was reported by some news channels. Wadhawan, one of the promoters of Dewan Housing Finance Limited (DHFL), is an accused in multiple fraud cases probed by the Enforcement Directorate and the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI). He was lodged in the Taloja jail prison in neighbouring Navi Mumbai. Special judge for the Prevention of Money Laundering Act and CBI cases M G Deshpande on Friday passed the order allowing authorities to shift Wad-



hawan. He was shifted to Nashik immediately, sources said. Recently, some news channels reported that whenever Wadhawan brothers -- Kapil and co-accused Dheeraj -- were admitted

to state-run hospitals, they met their relatives and used mobile phones and laptops.

The higher prison authorities then moved an application before the special court, seeking

to transfer Kapil Wadhawan to another prison. Kapil Wadhawan was admitted to state-run hospitals for different medical issues, but he did not actually undergo treatment during his stay there or even get checked up by doctors, the application said.

"It is a settled norm that a court should not get influenced by media publication and media trials, but at the same time, if some real picture, regarding conduct of the accused persons involved in serious offences, is reported by the Higher Prison Authority and upon examining the record if any substance is found in the report, certainly court cannot overlook and ignore it," the judge said. Wadhawan did not report any serious illness in his court applications, but the jail superintendent (Taloja prison) referred him to hospitals on 15 occasions between June and August 2023, the order noted, allowing him to be shifted to the Nashik Road Jail. Congress stops its 'Jan Samvad Yatra' in Marathwada after police lathi-charge in Jalna district



he Maharashtra Congress has temporarily suspended its 'Jan Samvad Yatra' in all districts of Marathwada scheduled from Sunday following tension in the region after police lathi-charge on Maratha quota agitators in Jalna district. "New dates will be announced soon," senior Congress leader and former Maharashtra chief minister Ashok Chavan said in

a post on X. Chavan, who was to lead the yatra in Marathwada, said it has been temporarily suspended due to the prevailing situation after the police lathi-charge.

On Friday, police batoncharged and lobbed tear gas shells to disperse a violent mob in Antarwali Sarathi on Dhule-Solapur road in Jalna after the protesters refused to let authorities shift a man on hunger strike to hospital during an agitation seeking reservation for the Maratha community.

Around 40 policemen and several protesters were injured and many buses were set on fire during the violence that erupted there. More than 350 people have been booked for alleged involvement in the untoward incidents. The Maharashtra Congress last month announced its plans to hold the 'Jan Samvad Yatra' from September 3 to 12 to reach out to the people and galvanise the cadre as well as to highlight "failures" of the BJP government at the Centre. State Congress chief Nana Patole had said their party leaders will travel at taluka, village and city levels in all regions during the period to "highlight the failures of the (BJP) government and spread the message of the opposition alliance". Maratha Quota Violence: District's top cop sent on madatory leave, say's sources

The Maharashtra government on Sunday sent Jalna district superintendent of police Tushar Doshi on compulsory leave, two days after protesters demanding Maratha quota were baton-charged, triggering violence, sources said.

Police have arrested 40 persons in connection with the violence that erupted in Jalna district on Friday, sources said.Police had baton charged and lobbed tear gas shells to disperse a violent mob in Antarwali Sarathi village after protesters allegedly refused to let authorities shift a man on hunger strike for Maratha quota to hospital. Several per-



sons. including 40 police personnel, were injured and more than 15 ST buses were set ablaze in violence. Some 360 persons have been booked in connection with the violence.

Many opposition leaders condemned police action while a demand was raised for state Home Minister Devendra Fadnavis' resignation. **PTI**

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi slams central government, says 'one nation, one election' is an attack on Union and its states



ongress leader Rahul Gandhi on Sunday alleged that the idea of "one nation, one election" is an attack on the Indian Union and all its states. In a post on X, Gandhi said, "INDIA, that is Bharat, is a Union of States." "The idea of 'one nation, one election' is an attack on the Union and all its States," Gandhi said. Gandhi's attack comes after the government set up a high-level committee headed by former president Ram

Nath Kovind on the possibility of holding simultaneous elections. Congress leader Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury has already declined to be part of the committee. He has also lamented the exclusion of Leader of Opposition in the Rajya Sabha Mallikarjun Kharge from the committee.

The government has included in the committee Ghulam Nabi Azad, the former leader of the opposition, instead of Kharge. The government on Saturday notified the eight-member committee to examine and make recommendations at the earliest on the issue of holding simultaneous elections to the Lok Sabha, state assemblies, municipalities and panchayats. Aditya-L1 Solar mission: ISRO said,"satellite is "healthy and operating nominally"



ditya-L1 spacecraft which was lifted successfully to study the Sun made its first earth-bound manoeuvre on Sunday. ISRO in its latest update said the satellite is "healthy and operating nominally" and the next manoeuvre is scheduled for Tuesday 0300 hrs IST.

Shifting the focus to its next space odyssey after successfully

placing a lander on the moon's uncharted South Pole region, the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) launched from Sriharikota on Saturday the country's maiden solar mission -- Aditya-L1. It carried seven different payloads to have a detailed study of the sun, four of which will observe the light from the sun and the other three will

measure in-situ parameters of the plasma and magnetic fields.

Aditya-L1 will be placed in a halo orbit around Lagrangian Point 1 (or L1), which is 1.5 million km away from the Earth in the direction of the sun. It is expected to cover the distance in four months' time. Aditya-L1 will stay approximately 1.5 million km away from Earth, directed towards the Sun, which is about 1 per cent of the Earth-Sun distance. The Sun is a giant sphere of gas and Aditya-L1 would study the outer atmosphere of the Sun. ISRO said Aditya-L1 will neither land on the sun nor approach the sun any closer. ANI.

Uttarakhand: Avalanche hits at Sumeru mountain around Kedarnath temple

n avalanche on Sunday hit the Sumeru mountain behind the Kedarnath Temple in Uttarakhand's Rudraprayad district, according to an official. However, no damage was reported due to the avalanche, the official added.

Avalanche hits Sumeru mountain in Uttarakhand."This avalanche has not caused any damage nor has the water level of Saraswati river increased", Utta-



rakhand DGP Ashok Kumar told ANI. "The situation in Kedarnath

is normal", DGP Kumar added.

Chilkur Balaji temple priest slams Udhayanidhi over his remark, says "Ask your father..."



The head priest of Chilkur Balaji temple, Rangarajan, on Sunday called on the people of Tamil Nadu to remove the Dravidian party from power and elect someone who believes in the temple system and Sanata Dharma. The statement of Chilkur Balaji temple's priest came in response to Tamil Nadu Minister Uddhayanidhi Stalin's latest remark on Santan Dharma at the 'Sanatan Abolition Conference'.

Rangarajan expressed strong disappointment over Udhayanidhi's remark and suggested him to ask his father (MK Stalin) about the history of Sanatan Dharma. In a video message, Rangarajan, along with other

priests of the temple, said, "We have seen the statement of Uddhayanidhi Stalin, who is the son of Tamil Nadu Chief Minister and the cabinet minister in the MK Stalin government. He is comparing Sanatan Dharma to malaria, coronavirus, and dengue. First of all, he is in a constitutional post. He is not supposed to speak nonsense or things like this, and he is also challenging that you people can go to any court. I am ready to face it. We'll not go to any court; why should we go to the court? We ask the people of Tamil Nadu and also Udhavanidhi Stalin to please read history and ask your father, under whom you have been trained." G20 Summit: Ahead of the meet Delhi traffic police conducts its rehearsal



s Delhi gears up to host world leaders at the G20 Summit under India's Presidency, Delhi Traffic Police conducted a full carcade rehearsal on Sunday. India will host the G20 Summit on September 9 and 10 in the national capital.

The two-day summit will draw leaders and delegates from 40 countries, including the 20 member states. The carcade rehearsals were carried out in the Shanti Van Chowk area of the

national capital.

Speaking to ANI about the G20 Summit carcade rehearsals, DCP Traffic Aalap Patel says, "Rehearsals are going on for the programmes that are scheduled on September 10. Full deployment is on the venues where delegations have to come on the same day. There was no congestion and traffic management was also fine. I would appeal Delhi public to also read the directories for September 8, 9 and 10 and contribute." ANI

North Korea to conduct "tactical nuclear attack" drill: Reports



orth Korea on Sunday announced that it carried out a simulated "tactical nuclear attack" drill on Saturday, Al Jazeera reported citing the state news agency KCNA. The drill was carried out with two long-range missiles equipped with mock atomic warheads.

According to the KCNA news agency, the practice was

conducted early Saturday to "warn enemies" that the country would be prepared in the event of nuclear war. With the tactical drill, North Korea laid emphasis on strengthening military deterrence against South Korea and the United States. Pyongyang has conducted a succession of missile tests and military manoeuvres in recent weeks, including a

botched spy satellite launch late last month.

This time for the tactical drill, the two cruise missiles carrying mock nuclear warheads were fired towards the West Sea off the peninsula, Al Jazeera reported. It flew 1,500km (930 miles) at a preset altitude of 150 metres, the state news agency said. It happened only days after the Ulchi Freedom Shield joint annual summertime exercises between South Korea and the United States ended on Thursday following an 11-day run that included air drills with B-1B bombers. North Korea, which has long criticised the drills as a dress rehearsal for war, fired two ballistic missiles on Thursday in response to the deployment of US strategic bombers, reported Al Jazeera.

Russian President Vladimir Putin will be meeting Turkish counterpar on September 4

President Vladimir Putin will meet his Turkish counterpart Recep Tayyip Erdogan on Monday in Sochi, Al Jazeera reported, quoting Russian Presidential spokesman Dmitry Peskov. Their talks come a week before Turkey and the United Nations seek to revive a Ukraine grain export deal that aided ease a global food crisis.

Peskov told the media persons on Friday, "It is true that the talks will be held on Monday. They will be in Sochi in the middle of the day."

As international attempts to patch up the Black Sea Grain Initiative, which sent grain and other supplies to regions of Africa, the Middle East, and Asia where famine is a growing threat, continue, the declaration put an end to weeks of speculation about when and where the two presidents may meet next. It came to an end in July when Russia abruptly withdrew from the agreement, as reported by Al Jazeera. Russia and Ukraine are important global providers of wheat, barley, sunflower oil,

and other agricultural products that are essential to developing countries.

The deal was mediated by Turkey and the UN in July 2022. During the war with Russia, it permitted Ukraine to resume exporting food from three of its Black Sea ports. Under the initiative, vessels sailed to and from Ukraine while ship and cargo inspections were managed from Turkey. While the deal was in force, around 33,000 tonnes of grain left Ukraine, according to Al Jazeera. ANI

While talking with ANI in Dharamshala on Saturday, Cederfel said, "For me, it's important that we as a country stand behind Ukraine and Ukraine's fight for their territory and integrity. It's not only about Ukraine, it's about the free world. It's about Sweden as well and we are a part of the Eu-

ropean Union. We support the sanctions on those people from Russia from Belarus who are on the sanctions list. They are not welcome to Sweden, not to the European Union," A group of Swedish Parliamentary Delegations led by Moderate Party's Margareta Elisabeth Cederfelt came to Dharamshala to attend the 63rd Tibetan Democracy Day on Saturday. **ANI**

Pakistan lawyers to observe a day strike against inflated electricity bills



he Pakistani lawyers have announced to observe one one-day strike on Monday against the inflated electricity bills and escalating prices of essential commodities, including petroleum products, Dawn News reported on Sunday. In decision was taken in the general body meeting of the Peshawar Bar Association with its president, Ishfaq Ahmad Khalil, in the chair.

According to Pakistan-based newspaper, the participants included members of the association, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Bar Council (KPBC) and Peshawar High Court Bar Association (PHBCA). The news daily reported that the PHBCA, with the approval of the KPBC, announced the boycott of all courts in the province on Sept 4 and took out a rally from district courts to the Rehman Baba Chowk near the

provincial assembly's building via the Khyber Road.

The meeting was addressed by the PBA office-bearers and members, who warned the government that if inflated electricity and natural gas bills weren't withdrawn and petroleum prices weren't reduced, lawyers would begin a protest movement across the province that would later be extended to other parts of the country. The speakers said lawyers won't tolerate "oppressive" policies of the government and would begin a protest movement on the pattern of their 2007 agitation against a military ruler for the supremacy of the Constitution and upholding the rule of law. Pakistan also observed a shutterdown strike on Saturday against the inflated electricity bills and inflation. ANI

US and Vietnam are boost their economic ties as China's increasing assertiveness in the region

he United States and Vietnam are boosting their economic and tech ties as China is increasing its assertiveness in the region, The Washington Post reported. In a bid to make stronger relations with Vietnam, US President Joe Biden will make a state visit to the country and is also expected to announce a deal to strengthen the economic ties between the two countries.

Vietnam is also trying to make the ties between the two countries stronger. The establishment of a "comprehensive strategic partnership" will give the United States a diplomatic status that Vietnam has so far reserved for only a handful of other countries: China, Russia, India and South Korea.

This move showed that Vietnam is willing to risk angering China but sees the move toward the US as necessary given how aggressively China is flexing its military muscle in the region, The Washington Post reported citing analysts. "If you have the United States on the same pedestal as China, that is saying a lot to Beijing, but also to the rest of the region and the world," said Derek Grossman, a senior defence analyst at Rand Corp and former US intelligence officer. "That's saying the US-Vietnam relationship has come a long way since 1995," when the two countries normalized relations. ANI
