ccording to the shocking revelation of BMC's birth and death registration data, 25% of the deaths registered in the Mumbai metropolitan area in 2022 were due to heart disease and hypertension. The city had registered 94,500 deaths in 2022. Heart problems are usually the leading cause for deaths in the city. In 2022, roughly three Mumbaikars succumbed to heartrelated complications every hour in 2022, according to the BMC data.

The officials Urged Mumbaikars to adopt healthy habits. The survey conducted in 2021 among citizens aged 18

to 69 years found that 34% had high blood pressure and 19% had diabetes. Nine out of every 10 Mumbaikars eat less fruits and vegetables than required. For early detection and treatment of heart diseases, the BMC in August 2022 started screening centres in its various hospitals and has so far tested 2.5 lakh people above the age of 30 for blood pressure and diabetes.

The BMC's door-to-door screening programme for hypertension has so far covered over 10 lakh people. While 68,000 were suspected to have hypertension in the house surveys and sent for further confirmation, only 9,600 were found to be actually suffering from it. One of the reasons for high levels of hypertension and subsequent heart disease could be excessive consumption of salt, said the civic health data. While the national average for daily consumption of salt is 8gm, an average Mumbaikar consumes 8.6gm daily.

The WHO recommends only 5 gm of salt consumption daily. To promote healthy lifestyle among Mumbaikars, the BMC has been providing dietary counselling which over 20,000 patients with high blood pressure and diabetes have received so far. A similar number have benefitted by participating in the 138 yoga centres started by the BMC in 2022.

Meanwhile, the annual deaths that registered a rise during the Covid pandemic years seemed to have decreased to the pre-Covid levels in 2022. The total deaths were 1.11 lakh and 1.08 lakh in 2020 and 2021 respectively, while it dropped to 94,550 in 2022 which is closer to the deaths in 2018 (92,041) and 2019 (90,339)

According to a civic official roughly 23,000 cardiovascular deaths in the city in 2022, around 17,000 were due to heart attacks. In Mumbai many deaths occurred due to cardiovascular diseases in 2022, revealed the civic health department.

ndia became the world's most populous country this year, overtaking China. Not surprisingly, India's population growth is posing significant challenges to its environmental sustainability, resource management and social development. The increasing population of cities without foresight or proper planning leads to land degradation, water scarcity, air pollution, waste management and great loss to biodiversity. Population growth, urbanization and environment are interrelated. effective Or sound urban planning is one that takes into account the social fabric and accommodates the needs of the growing population while minimizing its impact on the environment.

This is the need of the hour. In today's times, when large population growth can cause environmental stress, it is important to consider the broader context of this problem. For example, the per capita resource consumption and carbon footprint of developed countries is much higher than that of India. India should already learn the virtue of low consumption, so that it does not consume indiscriminately like developed countries can be avoided. With its increasing population, India should not proceed on the path of excessive exploitation of resources. For a true and sustainable future in the world, the architecture of cities will have to adopt a two-pronged approach.


The first approach is conservation, under which conservation of resources is necessary. This also includes reducing waste, repurposing and repurposing existing structures to help preserve the cultural identity of cities. Second, to collaborate with scientists and engineers. For example, cities need to collaborate with experts to develop new and more efficient construction technologies. India's population needs only 10 percent of the land area to settle and expand. Keeping this in mind, urban designers and architects can contribute to sustainable urban planning by designing sustainable, accessible and mixed-use structures

This will enable the development of public transport, pedestrian-friendly infrastructure and green spaces to reduce urban sprawl and promote efficient use of land. There is a need to give priority. Cities should focus on developing infrastructure, such as pedestrian and cycling, to promote non-motorized transportation

Carbon emissions can be reduced. Our architects in the country already have a well-crafted agenda of sustainable design. This includes facilitating the movement of natural light and air in houses and buildings. It has now become necessary to construct such buildings, where energy consumption is low or energy is

Now buildings are renewable will have to be adapted to energy sources. In a country like India, the use of mechanical air conditioning can be reduced by up to 85 percent. Architects can also play an important role in preserving and creating green spaces in urban areas. Parks, gardens and urban forests provide respite, helping to regulate temperatures and clean the air.

In urban construction, greenery on rooftops and agriculture can also be included in the building plan. The development of such facilities will also help in reducing the increasing heat and pollution in cities. This can be curbed. In view of the increasing population, it is necessary to be economical. If saved, just onethird of India's rainfall could provide more than 2,000 liters of water per person per day. Now 'Engineers working for humanity' have become very relevant. Social by connecting all urban plans Organizations and citizens will also have to be taken along.

Maharashtra govt will come out with rules on renting out premises: Minister Aditi Tatkare

he Maharashtra government will formulate a set of rules on renting out premises in buildings, state Woman and Child Development Minister Aditi Tatkare said on Saturday.

The minister's statement has come after a 35-year-old woman lodged a police complaint accusing a man and his son of refusing to rent out premises in a building to her as she is Marathi speaking.

According to the police, an

offence was registered against an 80-year-old man and his son for allegedly denying an office space to the woman at Shiv Sadan building in the eastern suburb of Mulund in neighbouring Mumbai.

A case under sections 341 (wrongful restraint), 323 (voluntarily causing hurt) and 504 (intentional insult with intent to provoke breach of the peace) of the Indian Penal Code was registered against the duo, who were produced in court and released on

bail, he said.

The minister on Saturday met the complainant woman at her residence and assured her of strict action against the accused in the case. **PTI**

With Killari quake management template, India can face any natural disaster confidently: Pawar



he administrative system to face any natural disaster in the country with confidence stemmed from the effective disaster management during the 1993 Killari earthquake in Maharashtra, NCP chief Sharad Pawar, who helmed the state at that time, said

He was speaking at a gratitude ceremony organised by an organisation of the earthquake survivors in Killari village of Latur district marking the 30th anniversary of the disaster on Saturday.

A temblor of 6.2-6.3 magni-

tude struck several villages in Latur and Osmanabad districts in the wee hours of September 30, 1993, killing approximately 10,000 people and injuring 30,000.

"Currently, India can face any kind of disaster confidently as the country has an effective administrative system in place which originated from the Killari earthquake. The country learned the lesson of disaster management from this massive disaster," said Pawar.

He said the UN and the World Bank had taken cognizance of this management. **PTI**

Goods train derails in Raigad district of Maharashtra; operations on Panvel-Vasai route hit



goods train derailed on Saturday afternoon in Maharashtra's Raigad district, disrupting operations on the Panvel-Vasai route, the Central Railway said.

Nobody was injured in the incident, as per the preliminary information.

Central Railway Chief Public Relations Office (CPRO) Shivraj Manaspure said four wagons, including a brake van, of the freight train, headed to Vasai (in Palghar district) from Panvel (in Raigad district), derailed on the Panvel-Kalamboli section at around 3.05 pm.

"ART (Accident relief train) from Kalyan and Kurla stations is being sent to the accident site," Manaspure said, adding that a Road ART has been sent from Panyel to the accident site.

After the incident, at least five passenger trains were detained at various spots on the Konkan-Mumbai route. **PTI** ▶▶ PAGE 1

Government says, "Shortage of anti-TB medicines are false, motivated are misleading"



edia reports claiming shortage of anti-TB medicines are false, motivated and misleading, the government said in an official statement on Sunday. "There have been some media reports claiming a shortage of anti-TB drugs in India. Such reports are false, misleading, motivated and seem deliberately intended to deceive and misguide people", said the official statement.

The treatment of drug-sensitive tuberculosis consists of two months of four drugs available as 4FDC (Isoniazid, Rifampicin, Ethambutol and Pyrazinamide) followed by two months of three drugs available as 3 FDC (Isonia-

zid, Rifampicin and Ethambutol).

All these drugs are available with sufficient stocks for time periods ranging from six months and above. The procurement process for these drugs for FY 2024-25 has also been started already, it said. According to the statement, the treatment regimen of multi-drug resistant (MDR) TB consists of usually four months of seven drugs (bedaquiline, levofloxacin, clofazimine, isoniazid, ethambutol, pyrazinamide and ethionamide) followed by five months of four drugs (levofloxacin, clofazimine, pyrazinamide and ethambutol).

In about 30% of persons with drug-resistant TB, cycloserine and

linezolid is required. Patients who are taking multidrug-resistant TB medicines form only 2.5% of the total TB-affected population. However, even for this group, there is no shortage, as reported, the statement added. Procurement, storage, maintenance of stock and in-time distribution of anti-TB drugs and other materials are being done at the Central level under the National TB Elimination Programme (NTEP).

In rare situations, states are requested to procure a few drugs locally for a limited period by utilizing the budget under the National Health Mission (NHM) so that individual patient care is not affected, according to the official statement. "As such, more than 15 months stocks of Moxifloxacin 400mg and Pyridoxine are available under NTEP. Also, Delamanid 50 mg and Clofazimine 100 mg were procured in August 2023 and supplied to all states and UTs. In addition to this, P.O. has been issued on 23.09.2023 for the supply of an additional 8 lakh quantity of Delamanid 50 mg tablets", the official statement said. In addition, the purchase orders were issued for the supply of three FDC(P), Linezolid-600mg and Cap Cycloserine-250 mg in August 2023. ANI

Manipur violence: Delhi remanded accused to two days of National Investigation Agency custody



elhi's Patiala House Court on Sunday remanded Seiminlun Gangte, an accused in a Manipur violence case to two days of National Investigation Agency (NIA) custody till October 3. The accused was arrested on Saturday from Manipur and brought to Delhi. He was taken to Delhi on transit remand.

It is alleged that Myanmar and Bangladesh-based leadership of terror outfits have hatched a transnational conspiracy to 'wage war against India'. Duty Magistrate Komal Garg remanded the accused after he was produced before her. NIA moved an application and sought 10-day custody of the accused for investigation of the case. During the hearing, the Duty Magistrate asked a query in regard to jurisdiction since it's a matter of special act.

The public prosecutor, then said that custody till May be granted till Tuesday so that the

accused is produced before the special judge. The federal investigation agency has registered a case under the anti-terror law Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA) and other laws. As per NIA, Seiminlun Gangte has been arrested in a case related to a transnational conspiracy by Myanmar and Bangladesh-based leadership of terror outfits to wage war against the Government of India by exploiting the current ethnic unrest in the State of Manipur. The case was registered suo moto by the NIA on July 19, 2023, in New Delhi. It is stated that an Investigation revealed that, Myanmar and Bangladesh-based militant groups have entered into a conspiracy with a section of militant leaders in India to indulge in incidents of violence with an intention to drive a wedge between different ethnic groups and to wage war against the Government of India.

LPG: Prices of commercial gas has hiked by Rs 209

n a major setback to LPG consumers, Public sector Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) have hiked the price of 19 KG commercial LPG gas cylinders by Rs 209. As per the updated price list, it will now cost Rs 1731.50 in Delhi, last month the price was Rs 1522.50. Similarly, commercial LPG price was increased by Rs 1839.50 in Kolkata, Rs 1684.00 in Mumbai and Rs 1898.00 in Chennai. Anxious shopkeepers are demanding from the government to control inflation

The decision to increase the price of commercial LPG gas cylinder by Rs 209 have left the

shopkeepers and restaurateurs running tea, samosa and kachori shops very worried. According to them inflation is continuously rising and the prices of commercial cylinders have already increased significantly.

A local shopkeeper from Aligarh said, "If there is an increase of Rs 209 now, it will aggravate our problems and we will have to face inflation on food items also. The government should reduce inflation and not increase it." Monthly revisions for both commercial and domestic LPG (liquefied petroleum gas) cylinders occur on the first day of each month. ANI

Afghanistan: 3000 families in the Baharak district are affected due to lack of safe drinking water



he Taliban-appointed officials of Baharak district in Takhar province of Afghanistan said 3000 families in the district lack safe drinking water, TOLO News reported. These officials called on the Taliban to address the issue. Abdul Majeed, a Taliban-appointed official in Baharak district, said, "There is a pool, and our people store the water in reservoirs and use it for drinking, ablution, and washing

Residents of the Baharak district voiced similar apprehensions saying that many people get infected each year due to the use of unsanitary water, TOLO News reported. Mohammad Nayeem, a resident of Baharak district said, "We store water here and use it for fifteen days, twenty days, or a month. Sometimes it happens that even the colour of the water changes", TOLO News reported. Ibrahim, a resident of Baharak district said, "If there is no water,

we will travel for about half an hour. That water is also not clean and is harmful to health," according to TOLO News report. Another resident said that children fall into the pool when they go outside to play or take water. Previously, residents of parts of the centre of Takhar had complained about the lack of safe drinking water and urged local authorities to resolve the problem.

Earlier, in July, Kabul residents expressed concern about the lack of safe drinking water in the city, TOLO NEws reported. Residents claimed further that they do not have access to city water supply services and the price of drinking water from private companies has also increased. A Kabul resident, Sher Mohammad, said, "People's problems are many. If you ring the bell, three days or four days later it will be your turn to get water. Water also comes at a high

Spain: Fire breaks out at nightclub, leaves atleast 7 dead



t least seven people were killed and four others sustained injuries after a fire broke out at a nightclub in Spain's Murcia on Sunday morning, reported CNN citing the local authorities. According to the Murcia emergency services website, the injured are two men and two women, ages 41 and 45 and 22 and 25 respectively, who were all rushed to the hospital after inhaling smoke.

Following the incident, the emergency personnel are searching for additional victims on-site,

if any. The origin of the fire, however, is still unknown.

"Worried and dismayed by the news coming from there (Murcia). The emergency services continue working," the President of the Murcia region posted on X. Emergency services were called in at the scene, and local firefighters asked the General Directorate of Security and Emergencies for a helicopter to help put out the fire. Later, the emergency services declared that ground resources were sufficient to do the job. ANI

UK: Glasgow Gurdwara strongly condemns the incident calls it as "disorderly behaviour"

lasgow Gurdwara has "strongly" condemned the incident, where Indian High Commissioner to the United Kingdom, Vikram Doraiswami was stopped from attending a planned interaction at the religious site on Saturday, Calling the incident "disorderly behaviour" by unknown individuals outside the Glasgow area, it further added that the Gurdwara is open to people from all communities and backgrounds.

"An incident occurred on 29 September 2023 at Glasgow Gurdwara where the Indian High Commissioner was on a personal visit, facilitated by a member of Scottish Parliament. Certain unknown individuals from outside the Glasgow area attempted to disrupt this visit, following which the visiting party decided to leave the premises," the statement by

Glasgow Gurdwara Guru Granth Sahib Sikh Sabha stated. It further said that the "unruly individuals" continued to disturb the congregation, adding that the Scotland Police has taken cognizance in the matter. "Glasgow Gurdwara strongly condemns such disorderly behaviour to disrupt the peaceful proceedings of a Sikh place of worship. The Gurdwara is open to people from all communities and backgrounds, and we welcome everyone openly as per our principles of faith," the statement added. This comes after a planned interaction of Indian High Commissioner to Britain, Vikram Doraiswami at the Glasgow Gurudwara was disrupted by some "extremist elements". Scotland Police has responded to the incident and said that an inquiry is ongoing to establish the full circumstances around the incident.ANI

US: State Department accuses of China expanding its disinformation been met with Beijing's Ministry

The US State Department's accusation of China expanding its disinformation efforts has been met with a counterclaim from Beijing's Ministry of Foreign Affairs, CNN reported, adding that the Chinese ministry said the State Department's report itself constitutes disinformation. The exchange occurred following the release of a report by the US State Department's Global Engagement Centre, accusing the Chinese government of intensifying its efforts to control information and propagate propaganda and disinformation that advances "digital authoritarianism" within China and globally.

The report alleged that China allocates billions of dollars annually to manipulate foreign information and highlighted Chinese leader Xi Jinping's significant expansion of initiatives to influence



the global information landscape, according to CNN.

Further, the report emphasised US concerns regarding China as a primary military competitor and a key rival in the battle of ideas and global disinformation. In response, China issued a counterstatement, asserting that the US State Department's relevant centre, which authored the report, engages in propaganda and infil-

tration under the guise of "global engagement." Beijing labelled it as a source of disinformation and the central command for "perception warfare." The Chinese Ministry of Foreign Affairs cited past examples such as the wars in Iraq and Syria and US reports alleging human rights abuses in China's Xinjiang region to argue that the US is, fundamentally, "an empire of lies," CNN reported. ANI


