he PIL filed in June this year has not come up for hearing as yet and as per the high court's computerised system, Thackeray's caveat is likely to be listed on October 20. The PIL had also sought direction to the state government to initiate contempt proceedings against the CBI officials who allegedly disregarded and defied specific directions from the Supreme Court in previous cases. Aaditya Thackeray filed a caveat in the Bombay High Court seeking to be heard before any order is passed in a PIL by a lawyer seeking direction to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) to

probe him in relation to the deaths of actor Sushant Singh Rajput and his former manager Disha Salian in 2020. Salian, 28, died on June 8, 2020, after falling off the 14th floor of a residential building in Mumbai's Malad. Sushant Singh Rajput died by suicide at his Bandra residence on June 14 that year.

Thackeray filed an intervention application through advocate Rahul Arote on October 13, stating that the said PIL was non-maintainable as the investigation in the Sushant Singh Rajput case is already being conducted by the CBI, the Supreme Court is seized of the matter,

and no order can be passed by the high court in this regard.

Petitioner lawyer Rashid Khan Pathan, who claimed to be president of the 'Supreme Court & High Court Litigants Association of India', had sought direction to CBI to conduct a custodial interrogation of Thackeray and that a comprehensive probe report should be submitted by the central agency.

Mumbai police still probing into the death of actor Sushant Singh Rajput in June 2020, an FIR had been filed in Patna on the complaint of Rajput's father against actor Rhea Chakraborty, his girlfriend. Chakraborty had approached the Supreme Court seeking transfer of the Patna FIR to Mumbai police as it was already probing the suicide. The Supreme Court transferred the case to the CBI.

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) is probing allegations of money laundering against Chakraborty and others based on a complaint filed by Rajput's father. The Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) was looking into the drugs case which was filed after Rajput's death. In July, this year, the NCB told the Supreme Court that it was not challenging bail granted to Chakraborty by the Bombay High Court in a drugs case.

The success ratio of ED and CBI investigations is less than 5 present in India. They don't reach justified conclusions. The cases are not closed, nor end, they are just kept pending, so that when arm twisting is to be done to gain political support, just open the files again. It happened in Sahar owners Subroto Roy's case, Mayawati and bros case, jayalalithas case, Mulayam case, Devilal son's and thousands. The people in both these institutions are not saints. They might have made lots of illegal money, but the beauty is none of them ever got caught or punished. The supreme courts fall in the same bracket. All these institutions and heads are the ultimate authorities and their judgements can't be challenged. Let it be UPA or BJP both used CBI to their advantage but since 2014 almost all the central agen-

The Enforcement Directorate started targeting Robert Vadra, they summoned Vadra several times in the name of investigation but they found nothing against him. ED questioned Rahul Gandhi and Sonia but no conclusion was drawn so far.

Mamata Banerjee's vigour and drive they once exhibited is lost now. It is not without reason that all of them fear BJP and their political strategy.

Be cognizant of your language



Court allows home-cooked food for Naresh Goyal in jail



SPECIAL court Wednesday permitted Jet Airways founder Naresh Goyal access to home-cooked food while in jail. The 74-year-old is lodged at Arthur Road jail after his arrest by Enforcement Directorate (ED) in September in connection with alleged money-laundering of Rs 538.62 crore loan given by Canara Bank to the company.

Goyal had sought home-cooked food referring to his health issues. The court had last month rejected his plea for home food stating that the medical officer of the jail would decide and fix the jail food suitable for him. He had again approached the court citing the various ailments he has and said that he requires a proper diet. Special Judge M G Deshpande allowed the application. "The accused is permitted to avail home-cooked food on a daily basis, as prayed, at his own risk and the risk of his family/relatives, until further order," the court said. On Wednesday, the court extended Goyal's judicial custody till October 30. He was produced before the court through video-conference.

Last month, Goyal had sought proper bedding facilities in jail citing his health issues, including having undergone a bypass surgery, diabetes, asthma, restricted mobility, neck pain and spine issues, due to a fall in June 2022. The ED had said his request must be decided as per the jail rules. The court had then directed the medical officer of the jail to see which bedding suits him and directed the superintendent to provide the same as per his health issues.

Maratha Quota: A man from Jalna district dies by suicide at Bandra

man from Jalna district who came to Mum-Labai for the cause of Maratha reservation allegedly died by suicide, police said on Thursday. He allegedly hanged himself with a rope under the Western Express Highway in the Bandra area of Mumbai. The incident is said to have happened on Wednesday night, police said.

The deceased is identified as Sunil Baburao Kawle, a resident of Chikangaon village in Ambad taluka of Jalna district, police said. A purported suicide note and a mobile phone were found in his bag, they added. In the suicide note, the deceased wrote. "People of the Maratha community should gather in Mumbai on October 24 for the movement for the Maratha reservation." At the end of the suicide note, he also apologised, police said.

The Kherwadi Police of Mumbai has registered a case. The body has been sent for a post-mortem examination, po-



lice said.

The Maratha community has been protesting for over a month for the community's inclusion into the OBC list in the state. Maharashtra Congress President Nana Patole earlier this month questioned the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)'s stand on the Maratha community's demand for reservations, holding the BJP solely responsible for the ongoing protests in

the state. "The thorns that BJP had sown to win the elections are now coming out, BJP should fulfil the promise it had made in 2014 regarding 16 per cent Maratha reservation. Now there is a BJP government in the Center and the state too. Why are they not giving reservations?" Nana Patole said while speaking to ANI. "BJP is responsible for the protests of the Maratha community," Patole said. ANI

West Bengal: IIT Kharagpur student found dead at hostel, Probe underway





fourth-year student of the Indian Institute of Technology, Kharagpur in West Bengal was found hanging in his hostel room on Tuesday, police said. According to the police, the deceased has been identified as K Kiran Chandra, from the Electrical Engineering Department of IIT Kharagpur. The deceased is a resident of the Medak district of Telangana.

The deceased's father, said, "Why is there so much stress

among students in IIT? He was stressed due to a project."

A statement issued by IIT Kharagpur noted that the student "chose the path of self-harm," while the police said they are investigating the matter. "With a sense of utter shock, the Students, Staff and Faculty members of IIT Kharagpur deeply mourn the sudden demise of K Kiran Chandra, a 4th year Dual Degree student in the Department of Electrical Engineering. He was a boarder

of the Lal Bahadur Shastri (LBS) Hall of Residence and chose the path of self-harm on the night of October 17, 2023," the statement said.

The institute informed that the deceased was with his two roommates in their hostel room and after an hour the other two students left, Chandra was found hanging in his room. He was taken to the BC Roy Technology Hospital where he was declared dead. "Till about 7:30 PM, K Kiran Chandra was with two of his roommates in their hostel room. Later, the other two students left for academic activities. Subsequently, around 8.30 PM, fellow boarders of the LBS Hall found his room locked from inside. The door was forced open and he was found hanging. The Security and other students brought him to the BC Roy Technology Hospital immediately. Despite all efforts by the doctors, Kiran was declared dead around 11:30 PM," the institute said. ANI

Jammu and Kashmir: A person posing as IAS officer dupes a resident over Rs 6 lakh in Budgam, held



man accused of impersonating an IAS officer and duping a local resident of Budgam of over Rs 6 lakh has been arrested, police said on Thursday. As per Jammu and Kashmir police, on October 18, Budgam police station received a formal written complaint from Ghulam Hassan Malik, a resident of Aalipora Putlibagh, about an alleged impersonation scam.

"The applicant accused an Ayush Koul, also known as 'Vicky', residing at Rose Lane No. 06, Rajbagh, Srinagar, of

posing as an IAS officer and defrauding him of Rs 6.5 lakh under the pretext of securing government job for the applicant's son. In response to the complaint, an FIR No. 302/2023 was registered under sections 419 and 420 of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) in police station Budgam. During the investigation, the primary suspect, Ayush Koul, was apprehended," they added. Moreover, Burhan Bashir, Koul's accomplice and a resident of Nundresh Colony, Bemina has also been arrested in the matter. ANI

Newsclick case: SC issues notice to Delhi police on pleas of founder and HR head against the arrest

The Supreme Court on Thursday issued notice to Le Delhi police on pleas filed by Newsclick founder and Editor-in-Chief Prabir Purkayastha and website's human resources head Amit Chakraborty challenging their arrest under Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) over alleged Chinese funding to promote anti-national propaganda. A bench of Justices BR Gavai and PK Mishra sought a response from Delhi Police and posted the matter for hearing on October 30.

Purkayastha and Chakraborty moved the apex court challenging the Delhi High Court's order upholding the trial court order remanding them to police custody. They have since been remanded to judicial custody.

The duo were arrested by the Special Cell of the Delhi Police on October 3 after it searched 30 locations connected with the





online news portal and its journalists in a case filed under the UAPA following allegations that it received money for pro-China propaganda. Purkayastha and Chakravarty subsequently moved the High Court challenging the arrest as well as the seven-day police custody and sought immediate release as an interim relief. According to the FIR, a large amount of funds to the news portal allegedly came from China to "disrupt the sovereignty of India" and cause disaffection against the

country. The probe agency also alleged that Purkayastha conspired with a group - People's Alliance for Democracy and Secularism (PADS) - to sabotage the electoral process during the 2019 Lok Sabha polls. The High Court last week rejected their pleas and said it is of the view that "the fact that serious offences affecting the stability, integrity, sovereignty and national security have been alleged against the petitioner, this Court is not inclined to pass any favourable orders." Israel-Gaza war: Britain's King Charles III has made a plea for religious tolerance and the importance of a multi-faith outlook, mourned for the loss of lives

ritain's King Charles III has made a plea for religious tolerance and the importance of a multi-faith outlook as he mourned the loss of lives in times of international turmoil, an indirect reference to the Israel-Gaza conflict in the Middle East. In a speech at Mansion House in the City of London on Wednesday evening, the 74-year-old monarch described the UK as a "community of communities" where shared values are the force holding it together and reminding that "there is far, far more that unites us than divides us". He stressed that British society was nurtured and enriched by citizens from the four corners of the globe, drawing upon deep wells filled with shared histories and experiences.

"One of my first acts as Sovereign, a little over a year ago,



was to open the doors of Buckingham Palace to the leaders of the major faiths represented across these islands; to welcome them, with respect and indeed love, and to re-dedicate my life to protecting the space for faith itself within our shores," said King Charles. "Such understanding, both at home and overseas, is never more vital than at times of international turmoil and heartbreaking loss of life...Even in the

most fractious times – when disagreements are polished, paraded and asserted – there is in our land a kind of muscle-memory that it does not have to be like this; that the temptation to turn ourselves into a shouting or recriminatory society must be resisted," he said.

The King called for the moderating forces of "civility and tolerance, on which our political life and wider national conversation depend" and warned against the "rancour and acrimony" of social media. In the wide-ranging speech, the monarch also reflected upon the advancement of science and the impact of artificial intelligence (AI). On a lighter note, he highlighted the importance of a healthy sense of humour that characterises British life. "The British sense of humour is world-renowned. It is not what we do. It is who we are. Our ability to laugh at ourselves is one of our great na-

tional characteristics. Just as well, you may say, given some of the vicissitudes I have faced with frustratingly failing fountain pens this past year," he said, with reference to a number of times when his pen malfunctioned while signing important documents in the past year.

The speech at Mansion House marks the symbolic arrival of a new monarch in the City of London, the financial hub of the UK capital. The ceremony dates as far back as the 14th century, in which the Pearl Sword is presented to the monarch who then returns it to the Lord Mayor of the City of London. The sword is in a scabbard covered with 2,600 pearls and the ceremony is a symbolic show of mutual respect between two historical powerbases - the British monarchy and the City of London. PTI

US: People supporting Palestine hold a protest in Chicago amid ongoing conflict



everal pro-Palestinian groups held an 'emergency protest' in Chicago on Wednesday amid the ongoing conflict with Israel, Reuters reported. Chicago Coalition for Justice in Palestine (CJP) and other groups reportedly blamed Israel for the bombing of a Palestinian hospital in Gaza.

The protests have been taking place all across the US with crowds divided on the recent situation around the Israel-Hamas war that has killed thousands of people on both sides, including women, children, men and the elderly. Public access to the Capitol complex has been restricted after a sizable number of demonstrators calling for a ceasefire between Israel and Hamas disrupted one of the House office buildings, ANI has learned from a source inside the Capitol Hill building. "We have been advised by the police to use the tunnels and not the main entrance and exit doors," a hill staffer told ANI, as the demonstrations unfolded, with mem-

bers from Jewish groups holding placards that read, "Ceasefire", "Jews say, Ceasefire now."

The House sergeant-at-arms sent out a memo to congressional offices that all visitors would be restricted to a single door in an attempt to control public entry into the campus. Several barriers of bike-rack fencing were erected around the Capitol building on Tuesday night as a precautionary measure in anticipation of the protest. Scores of demonstrators inside the building also chanted "ceasefire now" and were arrested by the Capitol Police throughout the afternoon.

The Capitol Police also announced they were closing down roads around the Capitol to ensure the safety of protestors outside. "A group of protesters are demonstrating inside the Cannon Rotunda. Demonstrations are not allowed inside Congressional Buildings," the U.S. Capitol Police said in a post on X.

Court's Same Sex Marriage Decision: A Victory for Indian Culture

he issue of legal recognition to same sex marriage has been a topic of hot discussion in Indian life for a long time. The Supreme Court has given a truly historic decision by refusing to recognize same sex marriage under the Special Marriage Act. If seen, this decision by the five-judge bench of the Supreme Court is a victory for Indian culture, Indian traditions, life values, ideals and Indian-ness. The Supreme Court has also refused to give same-sex couples the right to adopt children. The court's decision not only reaffirms the sentiments and values of the Indian people, but also warns the foreign forces who are conspiring to spoil the social and family character of India by blurring and hurting Indian values, culture and ideals. Certainly, this commendable decision by the Supreme Court is a unique initiative to keep intact and strengthen India's past marriage tradition and culture.

The Supreme Court has made it clear that it cannot make laws, it can only interpret them. It is the job of Parliament to make changes in the Special Marriage Act. Certainly, this comment by the Supreme Court is worth noting. Respected and learned judges have accepted that persons having homosexual or lesbian tendencies should be given the rights that they have as citizens, and they should also be given equal fundamental rights, like other citizens in the social sphere, but as far as their relations with each other are concerned, if it is a matter of marriage. then this matter should be looked into by the elected representatives of the people sitting in the Parliament. By the way, those who stood or still stand in favour of legalizing same sex marriage should understand that marriage has a deeper meaning in Hinduism, marriage, also called marriage, is a social union between two people of opposite sex. Or a religiously recognized union that establishes rights and obligations between those people, as well as between them and any resulting in biological or adopted children and grandchildren.

Marriage is a very important practice or sociological institution of human society. It is the core of the smallest unit that makes up society - the family. It is also the main biological means of maintaining the continuity of the human species. Marriage is not just an opportunity to enjoy sexual pleasure, but also a medium to carry forward the lineage. In Indian tradition and culture, through marriage, responsible tasks like maintaining physical relations, creating progeny, nurturing them properly, carrying forward the family tradition and making the progeny useful citizens of the society are also done. Whereas getting legal recognition of gay or lesbian marriages would mean attacking the ancient high and ideal values. It is not surprising that the support for such traditions has increased among the general public, as soon as it has entered the country like a storm from western countries, hence in reality there have been two types of perceptions regarding gay or lesbian marriages in the country. A large section of the country has been opposed to recognizing it at the legal and socio-religious level. That is also because such a free, unruly and arbitrary lifestyle is not allowed anywhere in Indian society. Anyway, wherever it comes to making laws, there must be an expectation that culture and traditions should not be ignored. Yes, a few people may also be in favour of legalizing gay or lesbian marriages.

Now the Supreme Court has handed down the issue to the Parliament, but the important question is whether the Parliament will take initiative in this direction and make such a law? Parliament should chart the way forward considering Indian tradition and cultural values in the broader context. The current government's stance on this question is hopeful, because the government argues that gay or lesbian marriages cannot be recognized, because husband and wife are defined biologically in the law. Accordingly, both of them also have legal rights. Legalizing gay or lesbian marriages will create a lot of complications in issues related to adoption, divorce, maintenance, inheritance etc. All statutory provisions relating to these matters are based on marriage between a man and a woman. The responsibility of taking a decision regarding legal recognition of this complex subject, which is entangled in ancient and modern thinking, now rests on the shoulders of the country's legislature. It can be expected that before making any



law on this subject, special care will be taken of the public sentiments and socioreligious beliefs.

India is a country with unity in diversity. There is opposition to same-sex marriages in almost all religions and sects. Recently such clear voices have been heard in the Sikh community. Akal Takht Jathedar Giani Raghbir Singh said that there is no place for same-sex marriages under Sikh principles. The Akal Takht has disqualified the priests from conducting religious services at the Bathinda Gurudwara after conducting same-sex marriages last month. The decision was announced by Jathedar of the Akal Takht, the highest secular body of the Sikhs, after a meeting of the 'Pani Singh Sahiban' (five Sikh clergy) in Amritsar a day before the Supreme Court announced its

Supreme Court has declared same-sex as a non-criminal act in 2018 itself; and inspired by this, many pro-gay organizations had filed petitions before the Supreme Court to legalize their marriages, which were opposed by the Central Government. How can the marriage of gays and lesbians be considered perfect? It may not be a marriage, it may be a mutual relationship, but how can it be given the recognition and all the rights of natural marriages? Therefore, considering the social structure of India. if the Central Government opposes the recognition of gay and lesbian marriages, then it cannot be held wrong in any way. Even though such examples have been found in ancient times in India itself or there are many such examples mentioned in religious texts which

point towards homosexual relationships, Indian society has always considered such relationships to be sexual, against nature and against social norms, placed in the category of sexual disorder. The sexual relationship between man and woman keeps nature dynamic. The meaning of home and family is the broader form of the results arising from the relationship between man and woman. The relationship between man and woman is the great journey of love and the child born from sexual relationship between these two is the basis for taking the family and lineage forward.

Man-woman relationships are not dependent on any religious belief rather they are a person's own scientific need. For new creation, union of opposite sex is natural, otherwise it is distortion. We cannot corrupt our culture and tradition in the name of blind imitation of the West. Even though times are changing, there are radical changes in traditions and new definitions of human relationships are being created, in India too two adult men and women live together without marriage in the form of live-in relationship. Therefore, if two people of the same sex want to live together, then the society can allow it by respecting their privacy; and their civil rights can also be protected. But as far as the Special Marriage Act is concerned, it can happen only between two people of opposite sex. Amending it would mean changing the conditions of marriage as well as destroying the concept of family.
