Maratha reservation: Activist Manoj Jarange gives ultimatum to state govt, says, "Will aunch fast untill

ctivist Manoj Jarange on Sunday said he would launch fast unto death protest from October 25 if the Maharashtra government fails to grant quota to the Maratha community by Tuesday. Addressing a press conference at Antarwali Sarati village in Jalna district, Jarange said the Maratha community would not let political leaders, including MPs and MLAs, enter villages across the state until the reservation demand is met.

Jarange had observed a hunger strike in this village in September this year demanding that Marathas be granted reservation in government jobs and education under the OBC category. He had withdrawn the protest giving an ultimatum of 40 days till October 24 to the government for the grant of quota. "If the Maharashtra government fails to take a decision on awarding reservation to the Maratha community by October 24, I will sit on fastunto-death agitation. Locals and people from other villages will also launch a similar protest," Jarange said.

He said all villages would join the indefinite hunger strike in the coming days and appealed to Marathas to take out a candle march to mark their support for the quota demand. "It is like a war being fought peacefully. I will declare the new directions on October 28. The government can't afford the direction which I will show to the people," he added. Jarange said he would abstain from taking water and medical assistance during the fast.

He said a chain hunger strike will be launched on October 25 which will manifest into a full-fledged hunger strike from October 28. "In every tehsil and village in the state, the Maratha community will organise candle marches, emphasising their commitment to non-violent demonstrations. 5 crore Marathas will participate in the protest." Jarange added.

He also appealed to the members of the Maratha community not to resort to

extreme acts like committing suicide. "Peaceful protests would pave the way for our rightful demands," he added. The activist accused the state government of trying to fan anti-reservation sentiments within the Maratha community. He also slammed Union minister Narayan Rane and Shiv Sena leader Ramdas Kadam without taking their names for their purportedly anti-reservation statements. Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde and Deputy CM Devendra Fadnavis had said the government was committed to giving reservation to Marathas while ensuring that quotas for other communities are not disturbed. It ended after the epic AIB roast but what it did begin, in the process, is the reintroduction of satire and sarcasm in its raw state without any censorship.

It should be the conscience of the audience that should decide whether to laugh or not to laugh at a dirty joke. This will inspire the comic to make changes in his content. Before blaming the artist for doing his job we should ask ourselves if we can take a joke as a joke or not. And what should be the joke in a real sense. There are also regional standup comedians who are quite popular in their niche audience. These are akin to different 'gharanas' of comedy like Gujarati, Bengali or Chennai- and Bengaluru-based comics.

Some great Bengali comedians like Sourav Ghosh, Anirban Dasgupta, Dipangshu Acharya. Language is just a medium that does not restrict anyone and there have been many regional activists whose voices were heard in the Parliament. But it's still a long way to go for the Indian stand-up comedy scene. In the recent past, you will see many stand-up performers in studios with an audience of 50 to 100. These artists make fun of each and everything having no filter on their language and expressions. Most of them use outrageous and obnoxious language. Some even make fun of religious beliefs.

In recent times comedian Munawar Faruqui has been hitting the headlines. Faruqui is a young and upcoming, moderately successful Indian comedian. He has been banned by the police

and administration of Madhya Pradesh on grave charges of hate crime. This comedian has a history of making jokes on Hindu gods. Ironically we never heard a joke about the Prophet of Allah. He compared the making of Ram Mandir with the making of Bombs.

Here lies the problem. How do we decide what is more offensive when there are different groups of people getting offended? For some, drawing a cartoon is the ultimate level of getting offended and for some it can be using some slangs for God and for some even mentioning names would be offending.

Has democracy and appearement of the minorities been of any use for the majority? Spitting filth against Hinduism in the name of freedom of speech is not secularism. Do crack jokes but crack jokes on the Prophet also and if you do not have the guts to crack jokes on the Prophet then do not crack jokes on Hindu gods also.

He is a Muslim, he knew that dragging Hindus in his acts will reiterate to the masses in not a good way which finally happened. I am a Hindu but I never mock any Gods, I am sure I can do a good comedy or be a good writer without putting down any God or religion. Munawwar is not only the comedian but he is an activist for a case which has been solved by the Supreme court, which means he has political inclinations which is fine as everyone in India has a right to have an opinion. But that does not give you permission to provoke religious sentiments. In the recent past he was frequently arrested and his shows were banned. Some think-tank believes that the arrest is to create anger in Congress men against BJP. This is election time and Munnvar like jokers became tools in political hands.


around nine percent.

Ban on Export of Sugar

The central government has imposed an indefinite ban on export of sugar to curb price rise as poor monsoon is likely to hit sugarcane output in two major producing states Maharashtra and Karnataka, Secretary, Department of Food and Public Distribution, Sanjeev Chopra said on Thursday. Sugar prices have hit a 12-year high in the international markets. However, the prices in India remain largely stable. Apart from sugar the government has also put curbs on exports of rice and wheat. The export of broken rice was prohibited and an export duty of 20 per cent was imposed on nonbasmati white rice on September 9, 2022. Subsequently, export of non-basmati white rice was also prohibited on July 20, 2023. That's an admirable step, first priority must be our nation and public in all aspects.

Fake call centre racket caught at Navi Mumbai, FIR against 23 persons

Police have busted a bogus call centre operating from a mall in Vashi area of Navi Mumbai township and registered an FIR against 23 people in this connection, including its owner and manager, an official said on Sunday.

The accused posed as representatives of US companies and sold medicines like Viagra and Cialis to people there. They obtained details of credit/debit cards of the people and cheated them, the official from Vashi police station said. Several gadgets, besides hard discs and electrical accessories worth Rs 3.97 lakh were recovered following a raid at the call centre on Saturday, he said.

The accused made outbound



calls using VCdial/Nextiva software. They made the calls through gateway bypass and VOIP, the official said, adding the accused were caught red-handed while indulging in such acts. The call center owner allegedly purchased the data of people in the US from a person based at Malad in neighbouring Mumbai and the employees used pseudo names to call up those people to sell the drugs. The drugs sale proceeds were credited into the account of an Indian company at a bank branch in Kharghar area, the official said.

An FIR was registered against 23 people under Indian Penal

An FIR was registered against 23 people under Indian Penal Code sections 419 (cheating by personation), 420 (cheating) and 34 (common intention) as well as provisions of the Information Technology Act and the Indian Telegraph Act, the official said. On Saturday, the Navi Mumbai police also busted a similar bogus call centre operating from a mall in Nerul area and registered a case against 13 persons in that connection. **PTI**

Western Railway: Train's coaches get separated at Marine Lines



Borivali-bound slow train departed from Churchgate station and uncoupled at Marine Lines

around 11.02 am, the Western Railway's chief public relations officer Sumit Thakur said. Three coaches from the rear end got separated from the rest of the train, he said. As per a statement from the Western Railway, the train had departed from Churchgate at 10.57 am for Borivali.

The passengers were deboarded and the train was taken to a car shed, it said. Following the incident, slow trains bound for Dahanu were diverted and operated on the fast track, it was stated. A railway motorman told PTI that the incident might have occurred due to some problem with the coupler that connects coaches. **PTI**

Police seized banned gutka and tobacco products worth Rs 7.39 lakh, 1 arrested at Airoli

Police seized banned gutka and tobacco products worth Rs 7.39 lakh from an apartment in Airoli area of Navi Mumbai township on Sunday, an official said. One person was arrested after the police conducted a raid in the apartment at around 1 am, the official from Rabale police station said.

Following the raid, the police seized the stock of different brands of gutka and tobacco products, he said, adding a case was registered against the accused under provisions of the



Indian Penal Code and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) regulations. The police were trying to find out from where the stock was sourced. The sale and consumption of gutka, scented and flavoured tobacco has been banned in Maharashtra since 2012. **PTI**

Navi Mumbai police held four Bangladeshi nationals for illegal stay

he Navi Mumbai police have arrested four Bangladeshi nationals, working as masons and construction workers, for living in the country without valid documents, an official said on Sunday. ST bus rammed into a crane kills one person at Mumbai-Ahmedabad highway

The incident took place at around 3 am when the crane which had hit a road divider on the highway was being reversed, an official from Palghar police station said. At that time, the bus, belonging to the Gujarat State Road Transport Corporation and carrying 35 passengers, rammed into the crane from behind at Dapchari check post on Maharashtra-Gujarat border, he said. The cleaner of the crane was killed in the accident. The body was sent to a government hospital for postmortem, the police added. **PTI**

CPI (M) leader Brinda Karat slams RSS says, "principles of India's "mixed culture" are being attacked by those who are a part of RSS"



Sikkim Floods: Indian Army, BRO, Civil administrations and local continue efforts to reconnect with northern area



fter the flash flood caused large-scale destruction in Sikkim, troops of the Indian Army, along with BRO (Border Road Organisation) and the assistance of civil administration and locals, are undertaking operations on a massive scale to reconnect North Sikkim. According to a press release from Defence, while BRO is trying to reconnect the main route

Mangan-Tung-Chungthang, the Indian Army along with BRO and the assistance of locals and civil administration, is making efforts to open up the alternate route Mangan-Sanklang-Theng - Chungthang. This requires construction of two bailey bridges over the Teesta River at Mangan-Sanklang Crossing. Working round the clock, the first bridge was completed on October 22 at 11 a.m.

of Mangan have remained cut off since October 4. As an immediate response, foot bridges and zip lines were constructed at Chungthang and Sanklang-Mangan Crossing. These have enabled the movement of people on foot and provision of relief material through the zip lines established. As an immediate relief to restore connectivity up to Chungthang via the alternate route Mangan- Sanklang-Theng - Chungthang, troops of Trishakti Corps are undertaking construction of a bailey bridge at Mangan-Sanklang Crossing, 200 metres upstream of where a bamboo bridge and Zip line was constructed earlier, the press release stated. However, the width of the river has increased to 600 feet, with water running along two channels with a 160 feet island in between. The decision was therefore taken to construct two separate bridges. Working on a war footing, the Army finished construction of the 150 feet long first bridge on October 22. ANI

Delhi: Air quality moves to a 'very poor' category with the Air Quality Index at 302

he overall air quality in the National Capital has deteriorated to the 'very poor' category, with the Air Quality Index at 302 on Sunday afternoon, as per data from SAFAR-India. In the morning, the overall air quality was recorded in the 'poor category' with an AQI of 266 against 173 recorded on Saturday.

According to the latest data from the System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting and Research (SAFAR), the air quality around Delhi University was recorded at 330 (very poor) at noon, while IGI Terminal T3 in New Delhi was at 313 against

276 in the morning hours. According to the System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting and Research, the air quality in Kartavya Path at India Gate was recorded at 266 on Sunday morning. Meanwhile, Noida recorded an AQI of 290 (poor) and Gurugram 152 (moderate). Anand Vihar breached the very poor category in New Delhi with an AQI of 345, IT0 with an AOI of 309. New Moti Bagh with an AQI of 360, Dwarkar Sector-8 recorded an AQI of 313. The air quality in the national capital on Friday morning was recorded in the 'moderate' category with an Air Quality Index (AQI) of 149. ANI

Punjab: Amritsar police busted smuggling gang, 3 arrested

n interstate arms syndicate gang was busted by the Amritsar police with the arrest of three people, an official statement said on Sunday. According to the official statement, 11 Pistols, 15 live cartridges and Rs two lakh were recovered from their possession.

The arrested accused were

smuggling arms from Madhya Pradesh and supplying them to Punjab, the statement added. Meanwhile, an FIR has been registered under the Arms and Money Laundering Act. Israel- Hamas war: Four deceased person's bodies were brought back to Kathmandu

odies of four students from Nepal killed in a Hamas attack in Israel have been brought back to Kathmandu on Sunday and are scheduled to be handed over to the family. Nepal's Foreign Minister as well as the Israeli Ambassador to Nepal reached the airport along with other government officials. Speaking to ANI, Israel's Ambassador to Nepal Hanan Goder said that they have 1400 bodies in Israel and they are identifying them. He spoke about Bipin Joshi, a student from Nepal, who has gone missing since Hamas launched its attack on Israel.

"We have 1400 bodies in Israel. We are in the middle of identifying the bodies. Not all of them were identified, not all of



the bodies of Nepalis were identified. Unfortunately, today four bodies arrived and the fifth one will arrive in a day or two, we still have five bodies to identify and we will take care and this is our responsibility, they are our family. Let me remind and not forget Mr (Bipin) Joshi. Mr Joshi was seen at the event and was taken by Hamas."

He further said, "We don't

know where he is, we are searching for him, we are calling the International community, we are calling the terrorists to release the citizens, to release the hostages. He was not involved; he was not part of this escalation." He made the remarks after taking part in the tribute ceremony held at Kathmandu airport. The bodies of Narayan Prasad Neupane, Lokendra Singh Dhami, Dipesh

Raj Bista and Ashish Chaudhary were flown to Kathmandu on Sunday. The Israeli Ambassador is scheduled to fly to Dhangadhi, the provincial headquarter of Far-Western Nepal to console the family as well as hand over the body to the relatives.

Speaking to ANI, Hanan Goder expressed commitment to the protection of the people of Israel from further attacks of

Hamas. He said that Hamas murdered civilians, including babies, tortured people and caused a terrible wheel of violence. He said, "We just have concluded the ceremony of receiving the bodies of the murdered Nepali students flown back from Israel. These brave students were murdered two weeks ago by terrorists of Hamas. Those terrorists invaded Israel, invaded our village and murdered these students. These students were not involved, the Hamas murdered civilians, babies, tortured people and created terrible wheel of violence. Israel know how to protect itself. Israel will know how to prevent escalation and we know current situation of Hamas in Gaza will not continue." ANI

Gilgit Baltistan: Resident protested against local administration, blamed the security forces for misusing the Anti-Terrorism Act against the activists and residents



Residents launched a protest against the local administration in the Skardu district of Gilgit Baltistan over the arrest of Shabbir Mayyar, a prominent activist who was demanding the opening of Skardu-Kargil Road. The occupied region has long been grappling with severe crises such as high inflation and shortage of commodities, and people have been demanding the resumption of trade with India.

The protesters blamed the

security forces for misusing the Anti-Terrorism Act against the activists and the residents. The protesters said they believed that the Islamabad-backed local administration in Gilgit Baltistan is against their reasonable demand for the opening of the Skardu-Kargil road and have been arresting those who speak up in their favour.

A local leader from the Awami Action Committee addressed a public gathering, demanding the immediate release of Shabbir Mayyar. "He (Shabbir Mayyar) is the voice of Gilgit-Baltistan. He should be released immediately. The only crime Shabbir Mayar committed was that he raised a slogan, 'Aar par Jod do, Kargil border khol do' (Remove barricades from the Kargil border and let the people commute). Whoever speaks of the Kargil border is threatened and punished by them," he said.

The arrest of Shabbir Mayyar and many other activists has triggered widespread unrest among locals. Another local activist said, "Our community is not afraid of anyone. Rather than listening to the public, they (the administration) are arresting the poor. They think that by arresting poor people, they can scare us. No, we aren't afraid. We are here to prove them wrong. Through this platform, I announce that we are all with Shabbir Mayar. Unless they are released, we will stand by them." ANI

Maldives: Tragic incident at Haa Dhaal Makunudhoo island leaves two dead, Indian High Commission 'deeply saddened'



¬he Indian High Commission in Maldives expressed sorrow on Sunday over the death of two Indian nationals in a tragic incident on Haa Dhaal Makunudhoo island in Maldives. Following the incident, the Indian High Commission is in touch with Maldivian authorities and the families of the victims. Taking to X, the Indian High Commission in Maldives stated, "We are deeply saddened by the tragic incident on Haa Dhaal Makunudhoo island in which two Indian nationals have lost their lives. High Commission is in close contact with Maldivian authorities as well as the families of the victims."

Two people were killed in a gas cylinder explosion in Haa Dhaal atoll Makunudhoo, Maldives-based The Edition reported citing police. The report did not reveal the identities of individuals who lost their lives. However, police confirmed that two foreign nationals died in the incident.

According to the police, the incident took place when a gas cylinder located near the fish market exploded, The Edition reported. The victims were identified as two foreign men and both were employed by a company engaged in land reclamation work for Makunudhoo Airport. Pictures circulating on social media showed some of the portion of the ceiling collapsed in a nearby building, according to The Edition report. Maldives National Defense Force (MNDF) along with the police is carrying out the investigation into the incident. ANI
