Shiv Sena MLAS disqualification Row

Thackeray faction of the Shiv Sena filed disqualification petitions against Shinde

fter the Supreme Court came down heavily on Maharashtra Assembly Speaker Rahul Narwekar for delay in the adjudication of the disqualification petitions, he is set to submit a fresh timeline for adjudication of the petitions within three months. Rahul Narwekar had clubbed the 34 petitions seeking disqualification of 54 Shiv Sena MLAs into six groups. He will conduct a hearing in the Shiv Sena MLAs disqualification issue Thursday. Last week, Narwekar clubbed the 34 petitions seeking the disqualification of 54 Shiv Sena MLAs of two factions - one led by Uddhav Thackeray and the other by Chief Minister Eknath Shinde - into six groups based on their similarities in nature and cause of action. The hearing on the first group of petitions will begin at 4 pm.

During last week's hearing, Narwekar also asked the Shinde-led Sena to submit before him by October 25 the same information that both factions had submitted in the Supreme Court. Narwekar is also expected to meet Advocate General Biren Saraf in Mumbai next week and also travel to New Delhi to consult Solicitor General (SG) Tushar Mehta before submitting the revised schedule to the SC on October 30 to discuss the issue.

Mumbai Millworkers and their misery is never to end?

illworkers misery is not new to the city, once mills and mill workers were the pride of Mumbai. But gradually many mills got shut and generation after generation the mill workers' families still struggled for justice. In the recent past thousands of former mill workers in Mumbai are still waiting for the houses they were promised in 2016. Delays in paperwork, changes in government, and the using these ready homes as quarantine centers due to COVID-19 have all contributed to the postponement. The houses, which were supposed to be handed over on Dussehra, are now expected to be completed by November. However, many workers are unsure and worried about the extended wait and the worsened condition of the houses.

In 2016, the lottery was held by Maharashtra Housing and Area Development Authority (MHADA) for subsidized housing for former mill workers and their families. Each was promised two flats of one-room-kitchen measur-

ing 160 square feet in Kongaon, Panvel, at ₹6 lakh. The land belonged to Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority (MMRDA) where the agency built the houses. Many paid up in 2019, after dipping into their savings or taking loans. Many of them sold their assets and are now literally bankrupt. The ready homes were repurposed by the Panvel Municipal Corporation as quarantine centres for affected patients. Post pandemic, the buildings were left in awful conditions, with broken doors and sinks stolen. The houses could be handed over in such a state. The conditions of these new houses have deteriorated. MHADA then floated a tender for repairs, adding an expense of over ₹52 crore. Government literally ignored the urgent requirements of the people.

Mills of Mumbai has interesting history, when the British and Portuguese decided to begin trade in India, they decided to make Mumbai as their foundation. It began around the late 1840s, when mills began to plant themselves around a location which now is the central part of Mumbai. The mills were set up towards central and south Mumbai, when the islands still existed and the land had still not been reclaimed. A significant rise in the port activity led to the businessmen, mostly from the Parsi community, to invest in the rising trade in Mumbai. Mills were then built with large hall spaces in order to function with at least one thousand workers in them.

The first mill in Bombay was projected in 1851 by Mr C. Nanabhai Davar and commenced work in 1854 in the name of Bombay Spinning and Weaving Company. The initial mills began around Tardeo and Byculla, and later began moving northwards. The mills once located in the central part of Bombay, in a vast area known as Girangaon – village of the Mills – that encompasses the localities of Byculla, Chinchpokly, Lalbaug, Poybawadi, Parel, Lower Parel, Worli, Deleslie Road and Jacob Circle to Dadar. The walls of these once-gargantuan structures remain in despair today in the company of junkies, and perhaps occasionally witness couples whose stories that faded away with time. Ironically, the Shiv Sena earned its spurs as a party when it took up the cause of mill workers in the 1960s. Today Shiv Sena unions have lost most of their ground in the area as they failed to protect the workers' interests. In the recent past Shiv Sena also lost its existence as it used to be earlier.

The first textile mill, Bombay Spinning Mill, was set up in 1854 in response to Britain's need for cotton textiles. At that time, cotton was imported from the United States but when the Civil War broke out in that country supplies stopped. This enabled the Indian textile industry to flourish. In 1961, the mills employed more than 2.5 lakh people. But a decline in imports owing to stiff competition from other countries started to lead the mills to ruin. By the 1980s the majority of the mills closed after a prolonged strike. Gradually, there were 58 mills employing a mere 20,000 people. Of these, 32 are privately owned, 25 are owned by the NTC and one by the State government. Twenty-nine private mills, declared sick by the Board for Industrial and Financial Reconstruction (BIFR), have shut down. The few mills operated by the NTC have incurred massive losses.

The mills issue has remained mired in controversy for years. For instance, activists say many private mills do not have the right to sell their property as they were given the land on lease for industrial purposes. Then there is the issue of compensation for workers. Over the years, several plans to restructure and make optimum use of the mill area were proposed. They remain on paper. Now nthe mill lands vanished, a whole chapter of Mumbai's history is lost. But a government keen on redevelopment does not want a millstone round its neck in the form of the obligation to preserve the past.

The strike led by Dr. Datta Samant involved 247,189 Mumbai mill workers and brought the city to a standstill. The 1982-83 strike was the last industrial action by the Mumbai mill workers when the city witnessed an industry-wide strike bringing the workforce to the centre of politics. While the present-day public memory of the strike has receded, it is important to remember the event which fundamentally transformed the city of Mumbai. The conflict between the mill workers and the owners began over the issue of bonuses. However, as the conflict gained momentum other demands were added, such as providing for an ad hoc increase of wage per month from Rs 120 to Rs 195 per month depending on the years of service. Secondly, to make the badly (make a shift) workers permanent who had worked for an aggregate period of 240 days. Thirdly, payment of House Rent Allowance (Rs 52 per month), Leave Travel Allowance (Rs 42 per month), and Educational Allowance (Rs 30 per month). Substantial improvement in leave facilities such as privilege leave, casual leave, sick leave, and paid holidays was also one of the demands. Finally, the strikers demanded non-recognition of Rashtriya Mill Mazdoor Sangh (RMMS) as the representative union, and the sole bargaining agent for workers. These demands shocked the employers. The mill owners were able to put down the strike by colluding with the state machinery and the RMMS, the officially recognised trade union, which had held a monopoly of speaking up for the workers. After this, about 91,251 mill workers were laid off. The catastrophic outcome of the strike also had national-level implications, as Mumbai's mill workers held the vanguard position of the country's labour movement. The failure of the 1982-83 strike crucially led to the reversal of the entitlements that the mill workers had obtained through various struggles and fundamentally altered workers' claims over the city's social fabric. Following the strike, the workers lost the fighting spirit, which they had demonstrated historically. Most importantly, the failure of the strike resulted in the gradual dismantling of the various social, political, and cultural institutions that contributed to the rhythms of Girangaon.

The failure of the strike was not merely a loss of that industrial action, but it had ramifications for the future strikes of the working classes. Since the late 1980s protests by the working classes in Mumbai became increasingly weaker in staking their claims. The disastrous outcome of the 1982-83 strike, thus, not only resulted in working classes losing their rights and privileges earned through various decades of struggles but it heralded the unmaking of kaamgarachi or shramikanchi (labourers) Mumbai.



No Compromise, Infrastructure Projects

The Centre expects its fertilizer outlay for the current financial year (2023-24) to exceed the budget estimate of Rs 1.75 lakh crore, due to a rise in input costs as the war in Israel has once again led to a spike in commodity prices, which had settled lower two years after the war in Ukraine began. One of the key inputs in the making of fertilizers is natural gas, which has also seen a rise in prices. In case oil prices remain elevated, that will lead to a higher subsidy outlay by the Centre. If it cannot make up the difference through higher tax and non-tax collections, then it may have to cut spending in welfare schemes and administrative expenditure.

However, there should be no compromise on capital spending for infrastructure projects. There must be an attempt to find as much savings as could be on administrative expenditure.

aharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde on Thursday announced an assistance of Rs 10 lakh to the family of Agniveer Akshay Laxman Gawate, who died in the line of duty in Siachen last week.

Elderly man duped of Rs 4.35 crore by cyber fraudster in name of PF payout

n elderly man from south Mumbai was allegedly duped to the tune of Rs 4.35 crore by a cyber-fraudster, who told him that he was entitled to get a Provident Fund corpus of Rs 11 crore, police said on Thursday.

The incident came to light after the 71-year-old man's wife approached the Cuffe Parade police station and lodged a complaint, an official said. "In her complaint, she said she received a call from a woman in May this year. The caller claimed that she was speaking from the Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO). In order to win the victim's trust, the caller provided all relevant information about the complainant's husband to her," he said. The caller also told the complainant that her husband's company had deposited Rs 4 lakh in his EPF account for a period of 20 years and he is now entitled to get the maturity amount of Rs 11 crore, he said.

The complainant's husband earlier worked in a prominent Information Technology (IT) services and consulting company. After his retirement, the couple had withdrawn invested funds post-maturi-

ty, the official said. The caller then asked the woman to deposit money required towards the payment of TDS, GST and income tax. Believing her, the woman transferred money into the bank accounts as per her instructions from time to time, he said.

"This way, the accused woman duped the couple to the tune of Rs 4.35 crore. The victim was asked to transfer money on several occasions between May and September under various pretexts. But when the caller kept demanding more money, the couple told her that they did not have any more funds" he said. The caller woman then started threatening that she would inform the I-T department, he said.

After they realised that had been duped, the couple approached the police and lodged a complaint on Tuesday, he said. Based on the complaint, a first information report (FIR) under Indian Penal Code (IPC) sections 384 (extortion), 419 (cheating by personation), 420 (cheating and dishonestly inducing delivery of property), and 34 (acts done by several persons in furtherance of common intention) and various sections of the I-T Act, including identity theft was filed. Army Chief Manoj Pande said, "Self-reliance, a key lesson" over Russia-Ukraine conflict



he Chief of Army Staff, Manoj Pande, said on Thursday that self-reliance is one of the key lessons in the Russia-Ukraine conflict, adding that India has done well there. The Army Chief was speaking at the curtain-raiser event of the Chanakya Defence Dialogue in the national capital.

He said, "Self-reliance is one of the key lessons in the Russia-Ukraine conflict and we have done well there. The lesson from the Russia-Ukraine conflict is

that land will continue to be a key domain of warfare where you have contested borders, as in our case. The victory markers will have to be defined in the land domain. That is not to suggest that the integration or jointness that we ought to achieve is not important but in my view, land domain is going to be more important."

Army Chief Manoj Pande said, "We are seeing unprecedented changes in the world. We're also seeing the centrality of national interests in global af-

fairs. The importance of national security is growing in international affairs." "The last year has been challenging yet satisfying. As far as the OP situation is concerned, it is stable and we have dealt with internal security challenges the way we are supposed to deal with them," he added. In response to a query about data and new technology being the new engines of war, Gen. Manoj Pande said that modernization and technology indication are central to the capability development programme.

"Modernization and technology indication are central to our capability development programme. We have been focusing on the infusion of new technology. We have identified 45 niche technologies that we need to follow. We have defined philosophy for Artificial Intelligence and machine learning. AI in terms of surveillance and image interpretation and the key is to interpret information quickly. In the field of robotics, we are looking at man-and-unmanned combinations," he said. ANI

he Anti-Narcotic Task Force (ANTF) of the . Himachal Police seized 9.923 kg of cannabis along with the arrest of two persons in the Mandi district, police said on Thursday. According to ANTF officials, the accused have been identified as Girdhari Lal Singh (26) and Arun Kumar (22).

"One car has also been recovered from the accused's posses-

sion," they said. A case under sections 20, 25, and 29 of the NDPS (Narcotics, Drugs, and Psychotropic Substances) Act has been registered against the duo at the police station in Sunder Nagar. The Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF) was constituted by the state police to curb the drug menace in the state. The ANTF has three field units at Kangra, Kullu, and Shimla in the state. ANI

Karnataka: SUV collide with parked truck leaves twelve people dead



welve persons, including three women, were killed after an SUV collided with a parked truck in Karnataka's Chikkaballapur near Bengaluru early Thursday morning, police said. The accident took place on National Highway 44 near a traffic police station. Police suspect foggy weather to have been the cause of the mishap.

"An Andhra Pradesh-based Tata Sumo collided with a truck around 7 am," Chikkaballapur Superintendent of Police DL Nagesh said. The deceased belonged to Kothacheruvu of the Gorantla area of the Anantapur district of Andhra Pradesh, the Superintendent of Police said. The SUV was crushed due to the impact and passersby along with police managed to pull out victims who were rushed to hospital. The five injured are undergoing treatment in hospital, the police official said. Further details about the deceased will be known after an investigation, he said. ANI

Karnataka: Electricity shortage, former government to be blamed

The state of Karnataka has been facing a huge power crisis for the last few months, which has led to mega protests by the opposition. The State is seeing an unprecedented demand of more than 15000 MW in October 2023, Energy Minister K J George said on Wednesday in Delhi. Blaming the previous government for the current shortage of electricity, George said, that if the power generation level had been better during the previous BJP Karnataka government, the State would not have faced such a situation today.

"The demand for power in the State has shot up this year compared to last year. In the last few years, power consumption has decreased due to the COVID-19 pandemic; however, the demand has been unprecedented this year. The power demand has been so



high that the power consumption in August has surpassed the summer months' consumption", the Energy Minister added.

"Power generation has remained the same in the last four years. Had the power generation level been better during the previous BJP Karnataka government, the State would not have faced such a situation today. In addition, the quality of coal allocated from the Central Government to the State is also not good. Along with this, due to lack of rain, this has adversely affected power generation. Power generation was doubled in our first term of government. In 2013-14, the electricity generation was 14,048 MW. It had increased to 27,780 MW by 2017-18", Energy Minister K J George added. ANI

US: Amid ongoing conflict between Israel-Palestine, Jewish students take shelter in college library as protestors were chanting 'Free Palestine'

mid the ongoing Israeli offensive against Hamas in Gaza following the October 7 terror attacks, a group of Jewish students took shelter in a library at Cooper Union in New York as a group of demonstrators chanted "Free Palestine" outside, The Times of Israel reported. The demonstrators kept pounding on the door as the students were inside the library, The Times of Israel stated in its report.

In a viral video shared on social media platform X, the Jewish students are purportedly seen inside the library as those outside pound on the doors chanting "Free Palestine". However, the



report, citing the New York Police Department (NYPD), stated that the Jewish students were safely escorted from the library. Over 1,400 people are believed to



have perished in the Hamas terror attacks while more than 5,400 were injured, The Jerusalem Post reported, adding that a further 222 people, mostly civilians, are

being held hostage by the terrorists in Gaza.

After Hamas terrorists, believed to be in excess of 2,000, infiltrated southern Israel by land,

sea and air, going into homes and unleashing terror on defenceless civilians, Israeli Defence Minister Yoav Gallant issued a stern warning to the terror group saying that "2023 is not 1943", referring to the persecution of Jews under the Nazi regime in Germany.

The minister said today's Jewish people possesses "different capabilities", Times of Israel reported. "We have been hit hard. Yet make no mistake - 2023 is not 1943. We are the same Jews, but we have different capabilities. The State of Israel is strong. We are united and powerful," he said.

Israeli fighter jets carried out airstrikes over 250 Hamas sites, including a rocket launch



he Israeli fighter jets carried out overnight airstrikes over 250 Hamas sites in the Gaza Strip including a rocket launch site that was hidden between a mosque and kindergarten, Times of Israel reported on Thursday. IDF has called this "another proof" that terror group Hamas uses "civilian sites for terror purposes".

The sites struck by Israel included Hamas infrastructure, command centers, tunnels, and rocket launchers, according to the IDF. The IDF said that the rocket launchers were "placed in the heart of civilian areas that fired toward Israeli territory throughout the war." It further said that the missile launch site

is "located adjacent to a mosque and kindergarten, which is further proof that Hamas deliberately uses civilian sites for terror purposes."

Israeli Air Force also said in a statement about attacking over 250 terror targets of Hamas in the Gaza Strip. "Terrorist infrastructure, combat tunnel shafts and launchers in a civilian environment; The Air Force attacked over 250 targets of the terrorist organization Hamas in the Gaza Strip. In the last day, fighter jets of the Air Force attacked more than 250 targets of the terrorist organization Hamas in the Gaza Strip," Israeli Air Force posted on X (formerly Twitter). ANI\

Israel- Hamas war: IDF shares footage of soldiers chasing, killing Hamas terrorists

In retaliation to the Hamas attack on Israel, the Israel Defence Forces (IDF) is striking down the Hamas terrorists to secure Israeli civilians in the Kibbutz Be'eri near the Southern Israel Border. In a video footage shared by IDF, soldiers were seen chasing a Hamas terrorists and neutralising them within minutes.

IDF shared a video on X, saying, "Watch this never-beforeseen footage of combat soldiers from the IDF's Shaldag Unit operating to neutralize terrorists and rescue the civilians of Kibbutz Be'eri." It added, "In the footage, you can see the IDF soldiers firing at the terrorists' vehicle, killing the driver who then lost control of the vehicle. The unit's soldiers then killed the other terrorists in the cell who tried to escape. At the same time of the counterterrorism activities, you can see IDF special forces rescuing the residents of Kibbutz Be'eri." Meanwhile, the IDF is preparing

for the ground offensive in Gaza under which the Israeli tanks and infantry targeted numerous terrorist cells and destroyed Hamas launch posts in Gaza.

Taking to X, IDF said, "In preparation for the next stages of combat, the IDF operated in northern Gaza. IDF tanks & infantry struck numerous terrorist cells, infrastructure and anti-tank missile launch posts. The soldiers have since exited the area and returned to Israeli territory." **ANI**

UK: PM Rishi Sunak announced that "World's first Al Safety Institute will be setup in the country"

The UK is to be the headquarters of the world's first AI Safety Institute as the country takes the lead in examining and testing new types of artificial intelligence, Prime Minister Rishi Sunak announced in a speech in London on Thursday. Ahead of hosting the first Global AI Safety Summit next week, the British Indian leader who completed one year in office this week said that he genuinely believes that technologies like AI (Artificial Intelligence) will bring a transformation "as far-reaching as the industrial revolution, the coming of electricity, or the birth



of the internet".

But like those waves of advancements and the many positives that they offer, there are also "new dangers and new fears" that need to be tackled head on. "Get this wrong, and AI could make it easier to build chemical or biological weapons. Terrorist groups could use AI to spread fear and destruction on an even greater scale. Criminals could exploit AI for cyber-attacks, disinformation, fraud, or even child sexual abuse," warned Sunak. PTI

Jan Aushadhi Yojana: Affordable Medicines for All

he Jan Aushadhi Scheme, initiated by the Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers in 2008, aimed to make affordable generic medicines accessible to the public. Over time, it underwent name changes and evolved into the Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Jan Aushadhi Yojana and subsequently the Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana (PMBJP) to enhance its implementation.

The primary objective of the PMBJP is to alleviate the financial burden on patients by providing them with quality medications, supplies, and surgical equipment at affordable prices. Additionally, it strives to raise awareness about the effectiveness of generic medicines and dispel misconceptions regarding their quality. Moreover, the program plays a crucial role in ensuring that women have access to menstrual health services throughout India.

The Pharmaceuticals & Medical Devices Bureau of India (PMBI), formerly known as the Bureau of Pharma PSUs of India (BPPI), is responsible for implementing the PMBJP. The establishment of the PMBI as an independent entity was aimed at effectively managing the Jan Aushadhi Campaign. The scheme involves various stakeholders, including government bodies, pharmaceutical PSUs, the private sector, NGOs, societies, cooperative bodies, and other institutions.

Under the PMBJP, Janaushadhi Kendras serve as the primary means to access high-quality generic medicines. The government has set a target of establishing 10,500 Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Kendras by March 2025. Currently, the PMBJP offers 240 surgical equipment options and 1,451 prescription medications. Moreover, it has introduced new



products such as nutraceutical items, protein supplements, masks, sanitizers, glucometers, and oximeters.

Janaushadhi Diwas, an annual event, is organized to promote the use of generic medicines and provide nationwide health checkups for the public. To facilitate easy access to Janaushadhi Kendras, the Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers developed the Janaushadhi Sugam Application. This user-friendly app enables individuals to locate nearby Kendras and compare prices of generic and branded medicines. Currently, the application is being utilized by over 11.74 lakh users.

The PMBJP has demonstrated remarkable performance, generating substantial revenues and savings for the public. In the fiscal years 2019-20, 2020-21, and 2021-22, the scheme generated

revenues of Rs. 433.61 crore, Rs. 665.83 crores, and Rs. 751.42 crore, respectively. Thanks to discounts ranging from 50% to 90% on generic drugs, supplies, and surgical equipment, citizens were able to save approximately Rs. 2,500 crores, Rs. 4,000 crores, and Rs. 4,500 crores in each respective fiscal year. In the fiscal year 2022-23, the PMBJP reported sales of Rs. 1,094.84 crores through its 9,188 shops.

Notably, the PMBJP has not only made quality medicines more affordable but also created employment opportunities. The scheme provides financial assistance and incentives to Jan Aushadhi Kendras, encouraging self-employment with sustainable and regular earnings.

During the G20 Health Working Group meeting, the delegates had the opportunity to visit a Jan Aushadhi Kendra and gain in-depth knowledge about this remarkable public welfare project. Impressed by its impact, some delegates expressed their interest in implementing a similar scheme in their own countries. India has graciously offered its full support and assistance to these countries, demonstrating its commitment to sharing the successful model of Jan Aushadhi and ensuring access to high-quality medicines at affordable prices worldwide.

Overall, the PMBJP has successfully ensured the availability of a wide range of quality generic medicines at affordable prices to a significant portion of the population. This has resulted in substantial savings for citizens. The scheme continues to expand its reach and offerings, benefiting more people across the country.


