Parade Ground. Rajendra Shukla and Jagdish Devda were sworn is as his deputies. Vishnu Deo Sai, a four-time Lok Sabha MP and three-time state BJP chief, was sworn in as the Chief Minister of Chhattisgarh, in the presence of Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Raipur on Wednesday. Current state unit chief Arun Sao and Vijay Sharma, an organisational leader, were sworn-in as the deputy chief ministers.

Mohan Yadav Wednesday took oath as the chief minister of Madhya Pradesh at Bhopal's Lal Parade Ground. Rajendra Shukla and Jagdish Devda were sworn is as his deputies. Yadav was a former education minister and three-time MLA from Madhya Pradesh's Ujjain South. While Devda belongs to the Scheduled Caste (SC), Shukla has emerged as the undisputed Brahmin face in the Vindhya Pradesh region. Among the attendees were all BJP big wigs like Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Union Home Minister Amit Shah, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, Maharasthra CM Eknath Shinde and other central ministers. They will also head to Raipur later.

Mohan Yadav has been associated with the RSS for a long time, thus edged out senior BJP leaders in the CM race. He is a three-time MLA from Ujjain South. A father of three children, Yadav has a

diverse academic background, having secured a range of degrees: BSc, LLB, MA, MBA and PhD. Yadav has been known as a proponent of Hindutva. He has also been embroiled in various rows in his political career. During his campaigning for the November polls, Yadav triggered a controversy when he asked the Congress leaders what was their worth.

The Congress, including ex-minister Sajjan Singh Verma, had accused Yadav of allegedly influencing the Ujjain Municipal Corporation to change the master plan of the city so that the lands held by his family were turned into residential areas in July 2023.

The attack resulted in the deaths of six Delhi Police personnel, two Parliament Security Service personnel, and a gardener. All the five attackers were killed by security forces. Indian authorities accused Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) – two militant groups operating from Pakistan – of perpetrating the attack, however, LeT denied involvement. All four were found guilty of playing various roles in the incident, although the fourth, Afsan/Navjot Sandhu, wife of Shaukat Hussain (one of the accused) was found guilty of a minor charge of concealing knowledge of conspiracy. One of the accused, Afzal Guru, was sentenced to death for the incident.

Today the Televised footage of the proceedings show members attempting to catch the intruders — identified as Sagar Sharma and Manoranjan D — as they climbed from desk to desk. Later, the Delhi Police detained both the accused from inside and identified them as Sagar Sharma (son of Shankarlal Sharma) and 35-year-old Manoranjan D, a resident of Mysore and an engineer by profession. Moments later, a man and a woman, identified as Amol Shinde (25) and Neelam (42), were detained for protesting outside the Parliament building, carrying cans that emitted a yellowish smoke. A visitor's pass was recovered after the two Lok Sabha intruders were caught; photographs of the pass indicate they were issued by the office of Prathap Simha, the BJP MP from Mysuru. Any visitor must clear multiple levels of security before being allowed inside Parliament.

The two detained outside Parliament have been identified as Amol from Maharashtra and Neelam from Haryana. Televised footage of the proceedings shows members attempting to catch the intruders — identified as Sagar Sharma and Manoranjan D — as they climbed from desk to desk. Both Houses were adjourned moments later. Meanwhile, outside the Parliament building, a man and a woman — identified as 42-year-old Neelam and 25-year-old Amol Shinde — were detained by local police outside New Delhi's Transport Bhavan, where they were protesting with yellow smoke. The

entire matter is being investigated thoroughly, said Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla following the incident. "Both of them have been nabbed and the materials with them have also been seized. The two people outside the Parliament have also been detained by the police.

Speaker OM Birla called a meeting of MPs later in the day, where he said all concerns will be addressed. A senior police officer explained that while the Delhi Police has the responsibility of providing a security cover outside the parliament, the security inside and at the entry/exit gates is not under their ambit. The parliament security services or CRPF must have detained the persons who were inside the Lok Sabha.

For now, we know the persons managed to get general visitor passes. You have to apply for these passes beforehand and a background check is done. Inside the building there are security checks and scanners. However, the persons managed to carry smoke sticks and then break into the Lok Sabha. At present, they are with the parliament security services. a very serious issue, it happened security breach under unfit BJP AT CENTER. It happened for the 2nd time under BJP rule.

ebris flooding magnitude estimation based on relation between dendrogeomorphological and meteorological records. Debris flood is characterized by a water-driven flood with high bedload transport inducing full mobility of almost all grain sizes, usually confined in a steep channel, and by the deposition of bedload-carpet accretion.


Debris floods are mass movement events which are usually triggered by intense short duration rainfall events. They often occur on alluvial fans in an alpine environment. Due to their server geohazard potential they pose a serious threat to infrastructure and human life. To minimize their threat, understanding of their past magnitude occurrence is crucial.

Dendrogeomorphology has proven to be a highly useful method in studies of past slope mass movements. However, establishing magnitudes of past events has so far been based on indirect indicators, such as: spatial distribution of affected trees, characteristics of tree

injuries and sedimentological records. In this study we present a method that directly estimates the magnitudes of past debris flood events on an alluvial fan using dendrogeomorphological and meteorological data sets.

The studied dendrogeomorphological data set is based on tree-ring series. Based on sudden growth suppression thirteen debris flood events since 1903 were dated. Meteorological data from a nearby meteorological station was used to determine the exact triggering meteorological event for ten events. Comparing the index of affected trees and calculated return period of an individual triggering meteorological event established the magnitude of debris flooding. We showed that more trees are affected at high return period/intensity of the triggering meteorological event and therefore higher magnitudes of debris floods.

This research presents the first combined use of dendrogeomorphological and meteorological data sets for magnitude estimation of historic debris flood events which could be successfully applied in similar environments.

Stop using newspapers to wrap, pack and serve food

The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has urged food vendors and consumers to stop using newspapers for packing, storing, and serving food items, with immediate effect. In a report the authority has warned that the ink used in newspapers contain certain chemicals that can cause severe health issues.

It is a common scene in India to see vendors and users using newspapers to wrap, pack and serve food.

As printing ink contains bioactive materials it can cause serious health problems. The ink used in newspapers, used for packing food, have chemicals such as lead and heavy metals that can enter the human body through the food served. This can contaminate food and cause health issues.

Also, as newspapers are exposed to various environmental conditions they become susceptible to contamination by bacteria and viruses and therefore cause foodborne illnesses. The food regulatory body also says not to use newspapers to absorb oil from fried foods. It has discouraged the use of newspapers for food packing with immediate effect and to use safer alternatives for hygienic food consumption.

Bombay HC asks ECI to hold the bypoll for the Pune Lok Sabha seat, higlighting people cannot be left out

he Bombay High Court on Wednesday asked the Election Commission of India to immediately hold the bypoll for the Pune Lok Sabha seat, stressing that people from the constituency cannot be left unrepresented for a long time. A division bench of Justices Gautam Patel and Kamal Khata ripped into the EC's stand on not holding the elections as it was busy with other polls, including preparation for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, calling it "bizarre and wholly unreasonable".

The Pune Lok Sabha seat has been vacant since the death of sitting BJP Member of Parliament (MP) Girish Bapat on March 29 this year. "In any parliamentary democracy, governance is done by elected representatives who are the voices of people. If



the representative is no more, another must be put in place. People cannot go unrepresented. That is wholly unconstitutional and is a fundamental anathema to our constitutional structure," the

The court passed its order on a plea filed by Pune resident Sughosh Joshi against a certificate issued by the EC to not hold the bye election to the constituency. The EC had said it would not be holding the bypoll on two grounds – one that it was busy with other polls including the preparatory activities for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections and second that even if the Pune bypoll was held the elected representative would get a very short tenure. The bench, however, refused to

accept these grounds and said both are not valid concerns. They are, in fact, an "abdication" of constitutional duties and obligations which cannot be accepted, it said. "The ECI is not only vested but charged with the duty and obligation to hold elections and see to it that any vacancy is filled in. The ECI cannot let a constituency remain unrepresented. Voters cannot be denied this right," the court said.

It noted that the term of the Lok Sabha ends in June 2024 while the Pune constituency seat has been lying vacant since March this year. "The ground that the entire machinery of the ECI was busy with the preparatory activities for the 2024 Lok Sabha elections borders on the bizarre," the court said. The court said these are not genuine difficulties expressed by the ECI to not hold the Pune bye election and hence they are wholly unacceptable. "No amount of inconvenience can undermine the statutory and constitutional obligations and duties cast upon the ECI. This is something unthinkable and would amount to sabotaging the constitutional framework," the court said in its order. PTI

Winter session of the state legislature: After security breach seen in Lok Sabha, deputy chairperson Neelam Gorhe gives strict instructions for not issuing passes to visitors



aharashtra legislative council's deputy chairperson Neelam Gorhe on Wednesday gave instructions to officials not to issue the council gallery passes to visitors, after a security breach in the Lok Sabha, sources said.

The winter session of the state legislature is currently underway in Nagpur. In a major security breach on the 22nd anniversary of Parliament terror attack, two intruders jumped into the Lok Sabha chamber

from the public gallery during Zero Hour, released yellow gas from canisters and shouted slogans before being overpowered by MPs. Around the same time, two persons, including a woman, also sprayed coloured gas from canisters while shouting slogans outside Parliament premises in New Delhi. Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla later informed the House that four persons have been arrested - two from inside the House, and two from outside Parliament in connection with the

incident. Following the incident, Gorhe gave directions to authorities concerned not to issue passes for the council gallery, as per the sources. Meanwhile, leader of opposition in the legislative council Ambadas Danve raised the Lok Sabha security breach and said the government should explain what happened there. He also sought to know what precautions the state government was taking against this backdrop.

Industries minister Uday Samant, who responded on behalf of the government, said that the Lok Sabha would reveal what exactly happened there. Samant added that the state government will take all the necessary precautions and is capable of ensuring the safety of legislators at the legislature. Later, speaking to reporters on the legislature premises here, former chief minister Prithviraj Chavan called the Lok Sabha incident a major scare and demanded that the government ensure proper security at the Vidhan Bhavan here. Fire broke out at Lokmanya Tilak Terminus station, no casualties reported



fire broke out in the canteen at Lokmanya Tilak Terminus station in the Kurla area of Mumbai on Wednesday afternoon, said officials.

According to the Mumbai Fire Brigade (MFB), "A level 2 fire erupted at around 3.02 pm on Wednesday in New Hall, LTT Terminus Platform No. 1, Tilak Nagar." "The fire was confined to Jahhar Canteen, 1st floor of platform 1. Subsequently, the PRS (booking counter) and announcement centre were vacated," added the officials. There-

after, officials from the MFB, police, RPF, traffic, ward staff and others were deployed to douse the blaze. No casualties or injuries were reported in the incident. "A probe into the incident is underway. The reason for the fire is yet to be ascertained," according to informed officials. Earlier in the day, a person sustained severe burn injuries in a fire that broke out early in the morning in a parking lot opposite the Trans Residency building in Andheri East. The fire was reportedly said to have been confined to three vehicles. ANI

Gujarat: State govt says, "It is leaving the of the Gujarat HC" over granting bail to Oreva Group CMD Jaysukh Patel in Morbi bridge collapse incident

The Gujarat government on Wednesday said it was leaving it to the discretion of the Gujarat High Court whether to grant bail to Oreva Group CMD Jaysukh Patel in the October 2022 Morbi bridge collapse case. Justice Divyesh Joshi reserved his order after hearing submissions of the petitioner, relatives of the victims, and the government. A suspension bridge on the Machchhu river in Morbi town of Gujarat collapsed on October 30, 2022, killing 135 persons including women and children and injuring 56. Jaysukh Patel was made an accused in the criminal case related to the tragedy as his company maintained and operated the British-era bridge.

Additional advocate general Mitesh Amin told the court that the investigator informed the sessions court on September 18 that all aspects of the probe into the incident had been covered. "The judgments (of the Supreme Court) have been placed by both the victim and applicant sides.



A bail application cannot be decided based on a judgment, it is always the discretion of the court (hearing the plea)," he said. Ten persons -- Oreva chairman and managing director Patel, two managers of his company, two sub-contractors who had repaired the bridge, three security guards and two ticket booking clerks employed at the twin entries to the bridge -- are the accused in the case.

Six of them were released on bail while Patel, the manager

of his firm and the two proprietors of Devprakash Solutions, the firm which had carried out repairs, are still in judicial custody. The accused are booked under Indian Penal Code sections 304 (culpable homicide not amounting to murder), 336 (act endangering human life) and 338 (causing grievous hurt by doing rash or negligent act).

While deciding the bail plea, the court may consider factors such as how long the petitioner is in jail, the completion of investigation, number of witnesses in the case, the accused being a businessman and there being no possibility of him absconding, Amin said. "Ultimately it is the discretion of the honourable court. I leave it to the discretion of the honourable court," the additional advocate general added.

The victims have filed applications in the sessions court seeking the addition of certain offences, Amin said, and noted that as charges were yet to be framed, any side can apply for adding or

removing any offence. Patel's lawyer Nirupam Nanavaty had argued on Tuesday that a large number of people rushing on the bridge and causing it to swing also acted as contributory negligence that led to the collapse.

Even if there was some deficiency on the part of Oreva Group in the maintenance of the bridge, it had no prior knowledge of such a huge crowd gathering on that fateful evening, Nanavaty argued. Having spent more than ten months in custody, the petitioner was not required to be incarcerated any more, he said, adding that the trial will take its own time and the court may impose any conditions while granting bail to Patel. He also argued against the accused being charged under section 304 of the IPC.

Opposing bail for Patel, the victims' lawyer Rahul Sharma said there was a strong possibility that the witnesses' records would be tampered with, and the offence he was accused of was very serious. **ANI**

West Bengal: NIA files chargesheet in a special NIA court in explosion at village Rameswarpur

he National Investigation Agency (NIA) has charge-sheeted seven accused in a case relating to an explosion in a litchi orchard behind Rameswarpur High School in the Beldanga area of Murshidabad in West Bengal.

The anti-terror agency filed the chargesheet in a special NIA court. The explosion took place accidentally on January 17 last year when the accused were in the process of preparing iron socket bombs in the orchard behind the school, located in village Rameswarpur, Babta-II Gram Panchayat, Murshidabad. Two of the accused, Iyasuddin Sk alias Chadi and Sukchand Ali, were injured in the blast, and the former succumbed to his injuries later. The duo had been fabricating the bombs, along with another accused, Mansur Ali alias



Mansur Sheikh and others, behind the school when the explosion occurred.

In his dying statement, Iyasuddin Sk revealed that he had been induced to make the bombs by one Imdadul Hoque, alias Imdarul Hoque, alias Anaj Master, and some others. Imdadul had also provided the explosives and other bomb-making materials for the job. A total of 75 live socket

bombs and other incriminating materials were initially seized from the crime spot, said the NIA. Subsequently, the agency said, based on the disclosures of two other accused, identified as Masadul Hoque alias Masadul Sk and Habibur Rahaman alias Habu, the police also recovered 12 iron pipes from the spot.

Another accused, Tahabul Sk, led the police to the recovery of 35 live iron stick bombs in two lots on March 28 and March 31, 2022, respectively. All the seized live bombs were disposed of after being rendered safe. As per NIA investigations, all the accused had entered into a criminal conspiracy to fabricate and store bombs for use in terror acts to spread fear among the local populace of Rameswarpur and establish their dominance in the entire area. t

Lok Sabha security breach incident: TN CM M K Stalin terms it as "Dangerous threat and urged swift action to be taken"

amil Nadu Chief Minister and DMK President M K Stalin on Wednesday termed the security breach in Parliament a dangerous threat and urged swift action and prompt probe.

In a post on X, Stalin said: "The unprecedented security breach in the parliament poses

a dangerous threat to our august temple of democracy." Further, he said: "Swift action must be taken without delay. I appeal for launching a prompt investigation, fixing accountability, and implementing measures to prevent future lapses, ensuring the protection of this vital institution with all the might at our command." **PTI**

Madhya Pradesh: live-in partner stabbed a woman for denying physical relation, arrested

he live-in partner of a 20-year-old woman was arrested in Indore on Wednesday for allegedly stabbing her to death for refusing to have physical relations with him, police said. The deceased and the accused were living together in a rented house in the city for the last few days after becoming

friends on Instagram, a police official said. Additional Deputy Commissioner of Police Abhinay Vishwakarma told reporters that the woman was killed in the couple's rented house in the Raoji Bazaar area on December 7 and her body was recovered by cops two days later on December 9. **PTI**

COP28 Summit: President says, "A historic package to accelerate climate action..." over fossil fuels

fter gruelling negotiations, countries have reached a deal at the COP 28 summit in Dubai, calling for "deep, rapid and sustained reduction in greenhouse gas emissions" and "transitioning" away from fossil fuels in the energy system in an orderly and equitable manner. The COP28 climate summit went into overtime with negotiators scrambling to reach a deal. Finally, on Wednesday morning, the COP 28 deal was adopted. The plenary erupts in applause following the adoption. This was the third version presented to the countries in about two weeks

COP 28 President Sultan al-Jaber said: "It is a plan that is led by the science ... a historic package to accelerate climate action." "This is the first time, we have language on fossil fuel," he said. However, the document does



not speak about the "phase out" of fossil fuels as several countries were opposed to the term. Instead, the document calls for transitioning away from fossil fuels in the energy system "in a just, orderly and equitable manner, accelerating action in this critical decade, to achieve net zero by 2050 in keeping with the science." It also lists 7 other steps to help reduce greenhouse gas

emissions. The document signals that countries agree that fossil fuels need to be replaced with clean energy and reach global net zero by 2050. It is the first time fossil fuels have been addressed in the climate talks. The signed deal calls on the parties for tripling renewable energy by 2030 and doubling energy efficiency. It also recognises that the costs of renewables are falling fast.

It carries the same text on coal from Glasgow, the current text calls for accelerating efforts towards the phase-down of unabated coal power. The previous draft document drew flak from European, Latin American and vulnerable island states after it dropped all references to phasing out fossils.

On Nationally Determined Contributions (NDC), the docu-

ment says new national climate pledges should be delivered in late 2024. There is very little on finance, an acknowledgement of the need for it, but no concrete numbers which means this becomes the main agenda item for 2024. Environmentalists have called the signing of the deal a "positive step however with gaps"

Aarti Khosla, Director, of Climate Trends said that it is the first time that there is recognition of transitioning away from fossil fuels in a COP text- essentially meaning slashing not just coal, but also oil and gas. "The Dubai deal is positive, however with gaps. coming alongside an absolute recognition of a warming world, and the need to take rapid action within this decade, the outcome text makes real concessions for gas and oil," Khosla said. ANI

Sri Lanka Debt issue: IMF said, "Country needs to enter into agreements with its official and private creditors before the second review"



International Monetary Fund (Peter Breuer has said the country needs to enter into agreements with its official and private creditors before the second review of the Extended Fund Facility (EFF), which is expected to be concluded by the end of the first half of next year, Daily Mirror reported. Breuer said the agreements that have been entered with

creditors in-principle need to be converted into real agreements before the second review. The IMF team is scheduled to visit Colombo from March-April next year and is expected to finish the second review by June. Sri Lanka has entered into in-principle debt restructuring deals with the Official Creditor Committee (OCC) led by France, China and India and also with Exim Bank of China.

However, Sri Lanka is yet to strike a deal with its com-

mercial creditors or bondholders. An initial proposal involving restructuring debt linked to GDP growth by the bondholders was rejected by the Sri Lankan authorities, as per Daily Mirror. In September, the IMF said that despite early signs of stabilisation, full economic recovery in Sri Lanka is not yet assured. Growth momentum remains subdued, with real GDP in the second quarter contracting by 3.1 per cent on a year-on-year basis and high-frequency economic indicators continuing to provide mixed signals. Reserve accumulation has also slowed in recent months, the IMF stated. An IMF mission team led by Peter Breuer and Katsiaryna Svirydzenka visited Colombo from September 14-27, to discuss economic and financial policies to support the approval of the First Review of the program under the EFF arrangement. ANI

Afghanistan: SC said, "It has issued punishment orders for around 350 people in last two years"



fghanistan's Supreme Court has said that it has issued punishment orders for nearly 350 people across the country in the past two years, TOLO News reported. TOLO News is an Afghan news channel broadcasting from Kabul.

The orders were implemented for those people who were sentenced by the Supreme Court to receive Hudod (the penalty laws of Islam), according to an official. The spokesman of the Supreme Court, Abdul Rahim Rashid, said that the punishment includes whipping and prison time. "After the Taliban came

to power, punishment orders were implemented on nearly 350 criminals," he said. On Sunday, a person who was accused of committing adultery was hit with 35 lashes in public, the Supreme Court said in a statement, according to TOLO News.

Some analysts said that these punishments in Islam are being implemented to reduce crime rates. A political analyst Abdul Jamil Shirani said: "This (punishment) becomes a signal to many other people of the society to not commit crime. Islam has allowed the judge to make such a decision that serves the interest of the Muslims." ANI
