

The Patiala House Court on Thursday allowed an application moved by one of the accused Neelam Azad's family seeking a supply of a copy of FIR registration under various sections of IPC and UAPA in connection with the Parliament security breach case. The court also allowed plea seeking court

direction to Delhi Police to allow Neelam's Lawyer to meet for legal advice during the custodial remand period.

Additional Sessions Judge Dr Hardeep Kaur said the concerned Investigation Officer is directed to furnish the copy of the present FIR to the applicant/accused as per law. The court also said, considering the totality of circumstances, this Court is of the considered view that the applicant/accused is entitled as a matter right to legal assistance and the right is available to her even when she is in police custody. In order to have an effective and meaningful interaction between the applicant/accused and

her counsel, it is hereby directed that on every alternate day, a 15-minute interaction of the applicant/accused Neelam with her counsel, as mentioned in the vakalatnama, be arranged within the visible range of the IO of the present case but outside his audible range.

STITOTO Dr. Vaidehi First time in the history of the Indian parliament 141 MPs have been suspended. Out of these, 95 are from the Lok Sabha and 46 from the Rajya Sabha. Above all a Supreme Court lawyer has filed a complaint against Trinamool Congress MP Kalyan Banerjee who has stirred a row by mimicking Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar during the Opposition's protest at the Parliament complex. The video of Banerjee derisively mimicking Dhankhar has since gone viral. The advocate, Vineet Jindal, has filed a complaint with Ethics Committees of Rajya Sabha & Lok Sabha and sought the expulsion of all the members involved in the incident.

In this entire saga, no media ever questioned the security lapses, attack on parliament and also the reason for such aggression by civil society. unemployment is the biggest issue in the country and the security breach in parliament exposed many things. BJP can never handle such humiliations. They knew that the opposition was not in a mood to spare them. They suspended hundreds of MPs.

Let me tell you this was not the first time some leader is mocking another leader; our PM Modi mocked many opposition leaders. He made fun of them by calling names and adding tags. Modi mocked former Vice President Hamid Ansari during his farewell event in August 2017,, one of India's most distinguished diplomats, reducing his identity to his religion and in effect alleging that his entire professional and political achievements were because of his religious identity. Unfortunately, these are our lawmakers, and that is our ruling party who ignore the crucial issues of the country but wasting their time on petty issues. Asking questions in parliament is considered a crime. Media has already become "His master's Voice" by keeping themselves as watch dogs. In the era of

#### Enzymes can degrade plastics Plastic products are a cemented part of

everyday life, from containers and clothes to bags, bottles and food packaging. However, plastics resist degradation, instead breaking down into smaller particles that invade natural ecosystems and threaten the organisms living in them, including humans. Polyethylene terephthalate (PET) a polymer widely used in common plastic products due to its durability and cheap cost ¬is a primary target for scientists to reduce plastic pollution. Utilizing enzymes and other biology-based methods to break down PET in plastic showing promise in the scientific community and forming the basis of many novel research projects. Scientists identified a mutated form of an enzyme called leafbranch compost cutinase (LCC) that degrades PET. This mutant LCC also retains the monomers of PET so that it can be repeatedly remade into highquality plastic products, an example of how plastic can be recycled in a circular economy. The LCC mutant enzyme can become a permanent solution to plastic recycling and can provide a insight for future enzyme studies for plastic recycling.

#### **Over 859 people have been arrested in drug-related offences at Thane district**



s many as 859 people have been arrested for drug-related offences in Maharashtra's Thane district from January 1 till November 28 this year and 723 cases registered in this connection, officials said on Thursday.

Drugs and other items worth Rs 4.01 crore were seized from drug-peddlers during this period, they said. These figures were provided by authorities during a recent meeting of the district-level anti-drug coordination committee presided over by Additional Commissioner of Police (Crime) Punjabrao Ugale and attended by senior officials of various departments.

"A total of 723 offences related to drugs were registered in Thane district between January 1 and November 28. As many as 859 people were arrested in these cases, and drugs and goods worth Rs 4,01,94,718 were seized from drug-peddlers," inspector Sanjay Shinde from the Thane police's anti-narcotics cell said.

During the meeting, Ugale directed the officials to intensify inspection of closed chemical units and to ensure that medical stores do not sell cough syrups and other such medicines without the prescription of doctors.

He asked the officials to maintain a strict vigil at landing points of various water bodies in the district.

The police official also directed that the details of drug addicts who come to hospitals for treatment be compiled and the same be followed up to identify drug traffickers, Shinde said. **PTI** 

#### Anti-Terrorism Squad helds two Bangladeshi citizens living illegally in Navi Mumbai

The Maharashtra Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) on Thursday arrested two Bangladeshi citizens living illegally in Navi Mumbai, said an official from the Maharashtra ATS. As per the received information, ATS officials raided a residential area in Navi Mumbai's Kamothe township and arrested two Bangladeshi nationals for staying in the country illegally.

This is not the first instance in the recent past when illegal immigrants from Bangladesh have been arrested in Maharashtra. Earlier this month, acting on a tip-off, a joint team of ATS and Pune police raided the residences of the suspects on Monday and arrested them. The arrests follow a joint operation between the ATS and Pune Rural Police, which arrested eight Bangladeshi nationals from Narayangaon town in Pune district for allegedly staying illegally in India. **ANI**

court in the interest of justice to kindly grant the permission to get the copy of FIR as well as the meeting with accused Neelam or any further relief may kindly be granted, stated the application copy. The Patiala House Court on Thursday has also extended the custodial remand of four accused individuals, Manoranjan, Neelam, Sagar, and Anmol, to the Special Cell of Delhi Police for 15 more days until January 5, 2024, in the Parliament security breach case.

The case involves a security breach that occurred on December 13, when two youths jumped into the Lok Sabha chamber during Zero Hour, setting off smoke cans and raising slogans.

The probe earlier revealed further that two pairs of shoes were made on a special order in Lucknow, as the accused learned that the shoes of visitors to the new Parliament were not checked and they could hide their smoke cans under their footwear, sources said. **ANI** 

#### Navi Mumbai: Police registers case against man and his parents for allegedly running an investment firm illegally

Police have registered a case against a man and his parents in Navi Mumbai for allegedly running an investment firm illegally and cheating four investors to the tune of Rs 52.08 lakh by assuring them high returns, an official said on Thursday.

The accused, from Uran area in Navi Mumbai, accepted deposits from the four victims between January and April this year while promising to get their money doubled in 30 days, the official from Uran police station said.

According to the official, the accused operated the investment business without due permission from the government and the Reserve Bank of India. Following a complaint by the victims, the police registered offences on Wednesday against the three accused under relevant provisions of the Indian Penal Code, the Prize Chits and Money Circulation Schemes (Banning) Act, and the Banning of Unregulated Deposit Schemes Act, he added. **PTI** 

#### BMC appeals people not to dump garbage in drains

he Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) has appealed to people not to dump garbage in drains and said it is planning punitive action against violators. The city civic body collected 1,042 metric tonnes of debris and 139 tonnes of solid waste in the last fortnight under the 'deep cleaning' campaign. It has been observed that people are frequently throwing garbage in drains of Mumbai after the deep cleaning drive, a BMC release on Wednesday said, adding that dumping waste in a drain blocks the wastewater drainage. **PTI**

## Chairman's micmicry controversy: Ruling party MPs stand in solidarity with Jagdeep Dhankhar



Ruling party members on Wednesday participated in the proceedings of the Rajya Sabha while remaining standing to express solidarity with Chairman Jagdeep Dhankhar after a TMC MP mimicked him in Parliament premises The treasury benches participated in the Question Hour proceedings while standing for about ten minutes. Among those seen standing were Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal, Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan, Transport minister Nitin Gadkari and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Prahlad Joshi.

A political row broke out on Tuesday after Trinamool Congress leader Kalyan Banerjee derisively mimicked Dhankhar during the opposition's protest on the stairs of Parliament against the MPs' suspension, drawing strong condemnation from the ruling BJP. The BJP also attacked the opposition over Congress leader Rahul Gandhi making a video of the performance by Banerjee.

As soon as the House resumed at noon, Joshi said, "In protest against the action of their party's former president (Rahul Gandhi) and in your honour and in honour of the Constitution, we would participate in the Question Hour while remaining standing in silence. We request for your permission". "We strongly condemn how Rahul Gandhi insulted you and your constitutional position. To tarnish a particular community and section of society is not right," he said. "As far as I have seen, this is the first time they have fallen to this level and there is no end to this. We strongly condemn this. They have been insulting people at constitutional positions," Joshi said.

The minister said for 20 years they "insulted" the prime minister because he comes from a poor family and belongs to the OBC background. They kept on "insulting" him even after he became the prime minister, he said. **PTI**

"We fought from our heart but if a man like Brij Bhushan, his business partner and a close aide is elected as the president of WFI, I quit wrestling," said a teary-eyed Sakshi, and kept her shoes on the table in a dramatic announcement. **PTI** 

## WB teachers' recruitment scam: SC issues notice to ED over bail plea filed by TMC MLA Manik Bhattacharya

The Supreme Court has issued notice to the Enforcement Directorate on a bail plea filed by jailed former West Bengal Board of Primary Education chairman Manik Bhattacharya in connection with the primary teacher recruitment scam. A bench of Justices Bela M Trivedi and SC Sharma sought a response from the central investigating agency and tagged the plea along with his another plea.

The apex court in its order on December 15 stated, "Issue notice. Tag with...". Trinamool Congress (TMC) MLA Bhattacharya filed an appeal challenging the November 16 order of the Calcutta High Court whereby his bail plea was turned down. Bhattacharya was arrested by ED on October 11, 2022, for allegedly not cooperating with the investigation.



Earlier, the top court had dismissed Bhattacharya's plea against his arrest by the ED in connection with alleged irregularities in recruitment. Both the ED and the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) have been investigating the case. The alleged scam involved appointments as teachers and non-teaching staff in State-run schools via illegal means. In his plea against the arrest, the ED had told the top court that Bhattacharya was a key person in a money laundering case relating to the alleged irregularities in primary teachers' appointments.**ANI** 

#### Health ministry sources said, "No plan to make Covid testing mandatory at airports"

There is no plan so far to make RT-PCR testing for COVID-19 mandatory at airports for travellers, Union health ministry sources said on Thursday, amid an uptick in coronavirus infections in India. Even though the number of cases is rising and the JN.1 sub-variant has been detected in the country, there is no cause of immediate concern as 92 per cent of those infected are opting for home-based treatment, indicating mild illness, they said. There is also no increase in hospitalisation rates and COVID-19 is an incidental finding in people hospitalised due to other medical conditions. **PTI**

## Pakistan: Amnesty International says, "deeply concerned" over excessive force against the Baloch Long March protestors in Islamabad



Frowning on the use of water cannons, tear gas and excessive force against the Baloch Long March protestors in Islamabad on Thursday, Amnesty International has said that it was 'deeply concerned' over the crackdown. It reiterated its demand to release all the protesters and drop the charges against them.

"Amnesty has reviewed videos showing water cannons, tear gas and batons being used against the protestors. Dozens have been detained and several others injured, including women, minors and elderly persons, violating their rights to liberty, security and protest," the Amnesty International South Asia, Regional Office said, taking to X. "Amnesty International reiterates its demands that the Government of Pakistan - Immediately release all protestors, and drop any charges brought against them for solely exercising their right to freedom of expression and right to protest," it added. Amnesty also called for an impartial investigation of all extrajudicial killings and enforced disappearances in Balochistan. Taking to X, it posted, "Conduct an impartial investigation of all extrajudicial killings and enforced disappearances, particularly in Balochistan, in line with international standards. Compensate families of victims of extrajudicial killings and those forcibly disappeared."

Meanwhile, the Official Account of Baloch Yakjahti Committee-Kech posted a video on X, that showed scenes from Barkhan Rukni where the Baloch people have blocked the main highway of Punjab to Balochistan against 'state terrorism' in Islamabad. "All the highways of Balochistan will be closed while the movement against state terrorism and Baloch genocide will be started in Balochistan from today," the council said.

"Let the state remember that they have not only tortured a few people, but they have declared war against the Baloch nation. By attacking Baloch mothers and sisters, the state has made it clear to the Baloch nation that the state considers Balochistan as its colony and does not consider the people here as human beings," the Baloch Yakjahti Committee said in a post on X. ANI

#### Nepal: AQI in Kathmandu has moved to "very unhealthy" category



The Air Quality Index (AQI) in Kathmandu has dropped to "very unhealthy" as the mercury drops, setting a record for the lowest temperature of the year. The minimum temperature in the valley dropped to 4.8 degrees Celsius, the lowest recorded temperature this year.

As per the pollution station set by the US Embassy in Phora Durbar, the AQI stood at 226 at 11 am local time while it had slid down to 168 at 2:45 pm (NST) as per the recording of the same station, still making the air unhealthy to breathe.

Meteorologist Sanjeev Adhikari from the Weather Forecasting Division said that the minimum temperature in Kathmandu Valley plummeted to 4.8 degrees Celsius this morning, marking the lowest recorded temperature this year. "This minimum temperature is the most chilling we've experienced in Kathmandu Valley this year," he remarked.

#### Taiwan: Ministry of National Defence says, "Eight Chinese aircraft, 3 vessels detected nearby"

aiwan's Ministry of National Defence announced on Thursday that eight Chinese People's Liberation Army aircraft and 3 PLAN vessels around Taiwan were detected at 6 a.m. UTC. The Ministry said that the Taiwan Armed Forces have monitored the situation and tasked appropriate forces to respond.

"8 PLA aircraft and 3 PLAN vessels around Taiwan were detected by 6 a.m.(UTC+8) today. #ROCArmedForces have monitored the situation and tasked appropriate forces to respond," stated Taiwan's Ministry of National Defence on X. Taiwanese officials have declared that they will take action in response to Chinese balloons flying in close proximity, contingent on threat assessments.

The defence ministry in Taipei emphasised on Wednesday that the

current surge in balloon activity is believed to be related to weather monitoring, influenced by the prevailing winds during this time of year, Voice of America reported.

The global concern over the potential espionage use of balloons gained traction in February when the United States claimed to have shot down a Chinese surveillance balloon. China, however, insisted that the balloon was a civilian craft that had unintentionally strayed off course.

With the upcoming presidential and parliamentary elections on January 13, Taiwan remains on high alert for various Chinese activities, both military and political. Officials in Taipei have issued warnings, suggesting that Beijing might attempt interference to influence voters in favour of candidates preferred by China. **ANI** 

# UK: Missing Indian national student found dead, probe underway

The UK's Metropolitan Police are on Thursday appealing for information to piece together the last movements of Gurashman Singh Bhatia, a missing Indian student whose body was found by police divers in a lake in Canary Wharf area of east London.

The Met Police said the 23-year-old had been reported missing after a night out with friends last Thursday, December 14. Officers went on to carry out extensive enquiries, including viewing CCTV, speaking to witnesses and analysing phone and financial data. Water searches were also carried out in the area and a body believed to be that of Bhatia was recovered by police divers in the water in South Quay.

Gurashman's death is being

treated as unexpected, and while there is nothing to suggest it was suspicious, we will ensure our investigation is as thorough as possible to confirm this, said Detective Chief Superintendent (DCI) James Conway, responsible for local policing in the Tower Hamlets area of Canary Wharf. Because of this, we are releasing a CCTV image of Gurashman that was taken before his disappearance and would like anyone who may have seen him in the Marsh Wall area on the evening of Thursday, 14 December and in the early hours of Friday, 15 December, to contact us, he said.

Conway added that this was an extremely tragic outcome to their missing persons inquiry and not the news he was hoping to give to Gurashman's family and friends. I send them my deepest condolences, he said. The police noted that although formal identification has not yet taken place, Gurashman's family has been informed. Meanwhile, anyone with information about Gurashman's movements has been asked to call 101 quoting the reference CAD5787/15Dec.

There had been widespread social media appeals by the Indian student community in the UK after the Sikh student was reported missing. What a tragic, heartbreaking loss of one of our beautiful lives. I had spoken to his father and friends only some days ago when we first found out he was missing and had been praying for his safe discovery, said Sanam Arora, Chair of the National Indian Students and Alumni Union (NISAU) UK. **PTI**
